## Exodus 20:2-17

"I am the LORD your God. I brought you 1 out of Egypt, where you had been slaves. Worship no god but me.

Don't make any idol in the form of any-2 thing in heaven or on earth or in the waters below. (Add all of the Deut. parallel which begin with what's here: the two passages are identical in this translation.)

You shall not try to control me by using 3 my Name, the Name of the LORD your God, for your own purposes: I won't let anybody get away with that. I punish the guilty for this desecration.

Observe the sabbath by keeping it holy. 4 You have six days to do your work; the seventh is a day of rest dedicated to me, when no work is to be done--by you, your son or daughter, your slaves, your animals, foreigners among you. I made everything in six days and rested on the seventh --that is why I blessed it, setting it apart as holy.

Treat your parents with deference, so you 5 may live long in the land I'm giving you.

Do not commit murder.

Do not commit adultery.

Do not steal.

Do not falsely accuse or give false tes- 9 timony against your neighbor.

Don't feed any desire you have for any- 10 thing that belongs to another man--his house, wife, slaves, cattle, donkeys, or anything else he owns."

## Deuteronomy 5:6-21

"I am the LORD your God. I rescued you from Egypt, where you had been slaves. Worship no god but me.

- Bow down to, worship, no idol: I the LORD your God tolerate no rivals: those who hate me I punish down to their fourth generation--which is the other side of my showing love to the thousands who love me and obey my commandments.
- You shall not try to control me by using my Name, the Name of the LORD your God, for your own purposes: I won't let any body get away with that. I punish the guilty for this desecration.

Observe the sabbath by keeping it holy as I the LORD your God have commanded you. Do all your work in six days: the seventh is a sabbath to the LORD your God: no work that day -- not you, your children, your slaves, your animals, foreigners among you. Your slaves must rest as you do. Remember you were slaves in Egypt and that I the LORD your God rescused you by my strong hand and outstretched arm; so the LORD your God has commanded you to observe the sabbath day.

Treat your parents with deference, as I the LORD your God command you, so you may live long and well in the land I'm giving you.

- Do not commit murder.
- Do not commit adultery.

Do not steal.

Do not false accuse or give false testimony against your neighbor.

Don't feed any desire you have for anything that belongs to another man--his wife, house, land, slaves, cattle, donkeys, or anything else he owns."

**NOTES:** (1) Sinai's order: liberation, theophany, theocracy. (2) Sinai's refusals: force, and the worship of the state. (3) Sinai's prohibitions: false worship, forgetting God, and behavior disruptive of stable social life. (4) Sinai's inference: our God-given rights rest on and derive from our God-given obligations. (5) Only God is in control, and asks for "the voluntary subjection of all members of the community to those policies of the sovereign stipulated in the Decalogue-Covenant. This was the constitution of the 'Kingdom of God'; that it existed at all is a historical miracle."--Geo.E.
