Mr. Haworth served his alma mater as Dean of Men and associate professor of history and government from 1942 until his retirement in 1961. Before coming to the University he had been a teacher at Ottawa High School for twenty-one years. He was author of two books: Ottawa University: Its History and Its Spirit, published in 1957; and Born Barefooted, a biographical history of life in the primitive Ozark hill-country, in 1969. He also compiled histories of the Kansas Baptist Convention and of the First Baptist Church of Ottawa.
