9-30 A.M.

The President, accompanied by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, arrives in State.†

The Prime Minister receives the President, the Queen and the Duke.

The President presents to the Queen the Defence Minister, the Deputy Defence Ministers and the three Chiefs of Staff.

The Prime Minister introduces them to the Duke.

The President and the Prime Minister escort the Queen and the Duke to their seats. The Prime Minister then escorts the President to the dais.

The National Flag is broken at the flag-mast and the President's Body Guard and the Band give the National Salute.§ Simultaneously a 31-gun salute is fired.

9-35 A.M. The Republic Day Parade (*Order of March given on opposite page*).

10-30 A.M. The Pageantry procession.

11-19 A.M. Fly-Past by aircraft of the Air Force (*Order of fly-past on the last page*).

National Salute.§

11-25 A.M. The President departs in State, accompanied by the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh.†

The Prime Minister, Ministers and Members of the Diplomatic Corps depart.

Other guests depart.

† *Every one will stand, and officers in uniform will salute, when the President's Standard of the Body Guard is carried before them.*

§ *Every one will stand, and officers in uniform will salute, when the National Anthem is played.*
