

AN ACT OF CELEBRATION

As the congregation begins to sing the processional hymn, "Praise the Lord! Ye Heavens", a banner with the words PRAISE THE LORD will move to the front followed by the choir. The choir will process up into the choir loft, which is the section immediately behind the pulpit. Since the baptistry curtains will be opened and the word "Shalom" will stand out, the cameras might make use of that from time to time. The banner will be carried to the north side. If some worship pictures can be superimposed over this, all the better.

The Word of Scripture - Dale Saxon (from the pulpit)

As we begin to sing a verse of the second hymn, a second banner with the words GREAT IS THY FAITHFULNESS will come in from the back and be carried to the south side.

The Word of Scripture - Byron Rogillio (from the pulpit)



There will then be a third hymn and a third banner with the words EXPECT A MIRACLE which will be carried to the north side and placed next to PRAISE THE LORD.

A fourth hymn will be sung and a fourth banner with the words BEHOLD! I AM MAKING ALL THINGS NEW! will be carried to the south side and placed next to GREAT IS THY FAITHFULNESS.

THANKS FOR OUR HISTORY

As soon as the last word of scripture has been read, Pastor Fredrikson will step down into the congregation and speak with Ralph and Kay Tingley, who will be seated in the front pew by the center aisle on the south side. There will be about a four-minute interview. They will stand and face the congregation. He will ask them to mention the main impression they have gotten in their writing of the history of the church and the second question will be to name two or three of the exciting, meaningful people who have had a great influence in the church's history. During their comments they will mention Dr. Harris, Laura Gardner, and Dr. Lee Bright. These pictures have been given to KELO.

Pastor Fredrikson will then step across the aisle and ask Louise Tiezzi, one of the 50-year members, to stand and face the congregation. He will ask her when she joined the church and what has meant the most to her being a part of the church. Does she remember any particular person that stands out in the life of the church.

Then Pastor Fredrikson will invite the people to join in prayer, singing the call that was used for over thirty years, "Sweet Hour of Prayer." Here would be a good place for a picture or two to be superimposed.

Maureen Knight will kneel before the communion table to lead in the prayer, which will be immediately followed by the congregation singing a capella "Alleluia."

ENGAGED IN THE MINISTRY OF RECONCILIATION

Following this, Pastor Fredrikson will step down along the south side of the sanctuary for brief minute and a half to two minute visits with Owen Halleen concerning Renewing Our Ties with Sioux Falls College, Myron Waagmeester about the Leighton Ford Reachout, Lonnie Anderson about the halfway house, Teri Williams about the Crisis and Help Ministry, and Becky Cook, a young person who has just returned from Oklahoma.



THE MIRACLE OF SEED FAITH

Victor Balla will speak a word of expectation, calling for the offering. While the offering is received, the choir will sing the anthem, "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee". The ushers will return with the offering while we sing the Doxology and there will be a prayer of dedication prayed in unison.

HEARING THE WORD OF GOD

Following this Victor Balla will sing a solo from behind the pulpit. The congregation will then rise for the reading of the holy scriptures which Pastor Fredrikson will lead in. The congregation will remain standing for the Gloria. The sermon will be given from behind the pulpit.

OUR RESPONSE TO HIS CALL

After the sermon the choir will sing "All Hail the Power". They will be accompanied by a brass ensemble, which will be seated below the platform on the north side.

Pastor Fredrikson will speak a word of invitation from behind the pulpit and the congregation will join together in singing "To God Be the Glory", a hymn of decision. There may be those who will come forward while we sing.

There will then be a benediction and response. The chimes will be played, followed by the organ postlude.


