1998 Football Braves



OTTAWA UNIVERSITY 1998 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Ottawa University Braves will be looking to overcome some formidable challenges in their 1998 football campaign. The Braves returned to the top of the KCAC as champions under first year head coach Chris Creighton in 1998, with a 7-1 conference record, and a 9-2 overall record that ranked the team 12th in the final NAIA poll, the highest ranked KCAC team. To pursue their 17th conference title, the Braves will have to overcome the loss of three graduated All-Americans: quarterback Ryan Ficken, receiver Tom Starck, and offensive guard Chris Steiner, as well as four graduated All-KCAC performers: Jason Feedback, Ronnie McKeefery, Robert Johnson and Joe Oldham.

The Braves return 15 offensive lettermen and 16 defensive lettermen to the 1998 squad. Leading the way for the Braves defensively will be seniors Adam Wait, all-conference linebacker Kendal Gunlock, and all-conference defensive end Jerry Berry. Senior Joel Moenkhooff will be called on to lead a young Braves secondary. Offensively, the Braves will look for seniors Brock Nessa, Josh Gehring, Chris Battle, and Jason Carlile to step into leadership roles if the Braves hope to return to the top of the KCAC and NAIA statistical categories. All-conference tight end Michael Hull should be a great target as he leads a young receiving corps.



OTTAWA UNIVERSITY 1998 SEASON OUTLOOK

Ottawa University enters its 25th season of volleyball with 7 returning players and 10 freshmen on the roster. Led by junior All-Conference hitter, Emily Mader, the Lady Braves have a young but experienced roster. Joining Mader are senior Abigail Owens, juniors Katie McDonald, Sarah Lord, and Lynn Turner and sophomores, Jamie Kempfe and Sonja Carlson. All seven players have extensive varsity experience and are great leaders for the ten freshmen.

Selected to finish 7th in the KCAC, the Lady Braves have no pressure when facing conference opponents. Fourth year coach Tracy Schmidt states, "We were picked a finish low due to the large number of freshmen on our roster and a couple of those freshmen will need to make a significant contribution to the varsity program."

To celebrate the 25th season of Ottawa University Volleyball, the Lady Braves will be recognizing all players from the past 24 seasons on Friday, October 30th at the home volleyball match. The celebration will continue on Saturday, October 31st with an alumni match at 9:30 a.m.


