During the program following the 1976 Reunion Banquet, Vera Goodman '52, president of the Alumni Association, cited Dr. Wayne D. Angell, Lewis D. Durant, and Jack E. Patty in recognition of their unique and outstanding services in their professions, and of their dedicated service to church and community and their loyalty to the University. Dr. Peter H. Armacost, University president, presented each with a bronze plaque commemorating the occasion.

Wayne D. Angell '52, professor of economics at Ottawa University since 1956 and Dean of the College from 1968 until 1970, also is actively engaged in banking and in farming and has entered government and politics on both the state and national levels. His leadership and expertise in these fields have been recognized and sought as evidenced by his appointment by the Board of Directors of the Federal Reserve Banks to its advisory committee on bank holding-company regulations; his election for two terms as Kansas State Representative (1961-1967); and his positions as

president of the Kansas Baptist Convention (1970) and program chairman for the 1973 and 1974 conventions of the American Baptist Churches in the USA. He has served on numerous state and local boards for the denomination and was moderator for the First Baptist Church of Ottawa for five years.

Wayne and his wife, the former Betty Barnett '53, are parents of Patrice Angell Pickering '75, a daughter Wynne, and sons Ryan and Wiley Angell; they have two grandchildren. Their home is at 1341 South Mulberry.
