All sections of the Class. were under
my care in Bible Lesson for one term
and a half. During this time we
considered the following books of the Bible
in respect to their purpose, contents,
Deuteronomy, Joshua, Judges, Ruth,
1st & 2d Samuel, 1st & 2d Kings,
Isaiah, Zechariah, Malachi, with
scarcely an exception there was the
same thoroughness and fidelity in
the study of the ~~people~~ Bible on the part
of the Class. as in the study of other
books.

Senior Preparatory.

The Senior Preparatory Class, read three books of Demosthenes orations; 12 pages of Homer, ^{they had} three weeks of special recitation in Greek Lessons and Exercises in Prose Composition corresponding to Jones. Prose Composition.

A special class began the study of Greek ~~with the~~ at the commencement of school with the purpose to overtake the class beginning the orations. Some of this number had studied Greek in other schools. They succeeded in their purpose.

Junior Preparatory.

This Class began Greek the beginning of the winter term. They have studied 30 chapters lessons in Kepp's Greek Lessons. They are now ready to begin the Greek

reader.

In our work in ^{work} Greek and in English
we have been greatly embarrassed
by the almost entire absence of

the ordinary helps. No map of the ancient world; no dictionary of antiquity, none of the books that are ^{as} indispensable to the student as the microscope to the Chemist: or the telescope to the astronomer. We ought to expended at least ^{\$}50 in affording the necessary means of instructions to the Secret Department.

In addition of the work of teaching and time spent in travelling as has been already mentioned I have endeavored to perform the duty assigned to me with others ~~of this Board~~ of soliciting money from the Churches of the State to provide for the University obligation. In doing this work I wrote 367.

Personal letters and sent away
a addition ^{mailed} 280 Circulars.

During the past six weeks, I have been
on the committee of the Ottawa Board
of Trade to solicit funds for a new
building for this university. I accept-
ed this task only at the urgent and
repeated requests of gentlemen inter-
ested in the school. In doing what I
have done I was obliged to be out of
school one week. And to give up
two of my classes. one to Prof Chamberlain
and another to Miss Jennie Sherman
of the Sophomore Class.

In recounting these varied
and multifarious duties I wish
to express my sorrow at their seeming
necessity in the existing circumstances.
Gentlemen cannot accept the responsibil-
ity of raising money for current

To the Trustees of Ottawa University:
Gentlemen:

I present the following account
of the work which I have done during the
past year. During the Summer following
last Commencement. I travelled in
the Northern and Central parts of
the State in the interests of Ottawa
University. Nearly six weeks were
spent in this work with good results.
During the year I have taught the following
Classes:

1. Sophomore Class: - ^{During the} Fall Term, this class
studied Lysias and read three orations;
~~and~~ the New Testament ~~Greek~~. They read
the acts of the Apostles, Romans, Ephesians
and Galatians.

In the Spring Term they read the drama
of Antigone by Sophocles.
I taught the Sophomores in History of

for new building and then give the
 strength of their life to the work of
~~the~~ teaching. Those who ^{attempt to} do it will
 suffer for it and the school will
 suffer for it. I express the hope then
 that the financial burden which has to
 a greater or less extent rested upon the
