

New Myers Library and Art Center Welcome Addition to Campus

With fanfare and warm welcome the Myers Library and Mammel Art Center opened this fall.

The low, modern building in the northwest corner of the campus occupies Bundy's Bay or Martin's Marsh and is outside the "lovers' lane" or diagonal walk from the Ad building to Ninth and Cedar.

The library was opened with fanfare on October 3. A student-faculty "book pack train" in three hours carried around 19,000 books from the old location in Women's Residence Hall to the Myers Library. (Incidentally, that unique move was pictured on TV and in major newspapers throughout the nation.)
