

Baker-OU Exchange Program Expands

This is the third year of Ottawa University student exchange with Baker College for upper division science and mathematics courses. In the exchange, Ottawa University has approximately ten students in mathematics, one stu-

dent in physical chemistry and nine students in physics

Dr. Diaz said the purposes of the exchange are to increase class competition and to increase the total number of students in a

small department. The advantages of the exchange program to the individual students are that some of the courses that Baker may offer are not given here the particular year that the student may need it, and that the student, coming from a small department with only a few instructors, will be exposed to a wider field of attitudes and points of view.

“In the last two years the exchange program included courses only in chemistry. This year the program was expanded to include courses in junior physics and physical chemistry. The courses involve two formal lectures and two recitation and drill sessions a week. The lectures are given equally by Dr. Lewis Spencer of Ottawa University and Professor Raymond Spear of Baker College. Occasionally Dr. Justo Diaz of Ottawa University will lecture.

The classes are usually in the late afternoon after three o'clock. The purpose of this is to refrain from breaking up a student's day. The drive between the schools is one half hour one way and the schools, upon request, will provide transportation at no extra charge.
