- Our Response

The World That Has Shaped Our Young People

① Revolution, Upheaval, Fear and Violence.

- Peoples seeking for a better way of life.
- New Goals being formed better-shelter.
- Massive Game of Power Politics.
- Great Debate Over Fuel Our Shelters.

② World of Fantastic Mobility.

- The Shift of Peoples. 25% by the end of the year.
- The Space Race.
- The Use of War. Greater Influence than T.V., Movies or Atom Bombs.

③ Period of Great Intellectual Confusion

- Great Landmarks in Thought are passing.
- Replaced by Existentialism, Pragmatism and Materialism.
- The University Community has become a market place.
- The forces that play on many of us are what they say or what they do.
- "Post-Christian" Era

④ We Has led to Great Moral Confusion

- We cling to the form. but the Substance is gone. Belief in God has died as of we never lived. Why
- We are subject to the whims and fancies of Modern life.

⑤ We are trying to insulate our Young People

- Life must not be tough for them as it was for us.
- So tell the young people have what they want.

Now What Characterizes Our Young People

① They are Confused on Central Issues

- No great Intellectual or Political commitments.
- A Little Mixture of Sartre, Camus or Nietzsche
- A Very few Students Cared About
- Any of The Great Issues.
- This is Shown by Clearly in a Lack of Understanding of Democracy or Communism.

② Great Confusion on Morals

- Jacobs Study on Changing Values on the College Campus.
- Jerome Ellison on Cheating.
- 46% Admit frequent cheating.
- Caused by pressure to Succeed.

Upper Classman to Incoming Freshman!

"Now when you get there remember books are for the birds - not for people. What matters is contacts. Get there a couple of days early, introduce yourself around, become known, get elected to a class office, plan your courses so you are not always on the books so you have time to make contacts."

③ Young People are Extremely Self-Centers.

- Little Deep Concern for Their World.
- Turned in on Themselves - Gallup Polling
- 146% of Young fear nuclear war.
- 259% of men afraid of personal failure
- Girls expressed concern over social insecurity & not being loved.
- They want success.

④ These Young People are Great Conformists

- Are Products of Mass Media
- Men in Herds and Love Follower.
- Resmann on College Study
- They want to work in Great Corporations
- The Children of Organization, Not the Masters of it.

⑤ Will better for Low Success Rate than High Success Rate

- No better to compromise than miser.
- Keep what you have rather than making loss.
- The Typical Young Person.
 - 6' 3" whining boy who has had 3 cars and a motor scooter in the last 2 years.
 - College fellow who wants a career in Navy so he can retire early.
 - Texas Boy who wants to travel - First class of course.
