Dr Harlan himself at one stage of the proceedings engaged in personal controversy of 'warm chararter with the "Sage of Troy" over the place of college men in politics "The speech. es at the bnnquet were of a very high order" Dr Harlan went on, "and I was efpecially inpressed by the strong appeal of Mrs. Anna Shaw of Boston to women without a party home to join in the Progressive movement. If other states are in anything like the mood that Kansas Is in as shown by the Topeka meeting, the Progressive party has not only come to stay, but it is going to be the dcminant political party very soon. It makes a man's heart thrill to be lined up with a movement that bodes so well for the future of the country."
