The Committee to which was referred the reports of the President, Professors and Librarian be so have to make the following recommendations -

1st
It approves the recommendation of associating honors courses with the regular curriculum - That is - It will allow students who secure 85% in the regular courses to take additional work of one course for one year in the junior or senior classes - and if the work is approved they shall be called honors scholars and they shall have that merit in their graduation.

2^d
The degree of A.M. or of M. A. or of M. Lit. shall be given to a bachelor of corresponding degree on the completion of the third year from his graduation with the following conditions. viz. He shall do one year additional work on these studies under the direction and approval of the professors of the University. The studies, of course, shall neither be elementary on the one hand nor professional on the other. but shall be advanced studies germane to his bachelor degree -
