Teachers for Next Year.

The General Board voted last June that the faculty of the University, at that time be elected permanently. In case of dismissal or resignation three months notice should be given. The question of Salary to be determined each year by the General Board.

The present faculty, we understand, would prefer to have their salaries some definite sum, rather than Conditional, as last year.

The Committee on Internal Management recommended that no changes be made in the present faculty, other than the contemplated change in the President, which matter has been before the General Board. They also recommended that Dr. S. C. Cline be added to the faculty so the matter of making arrangements of making for the ensuing year, so far as teachers are concerned devolve upon the Sec. Com. They have employed Dr. S. Cline as Professor of English and didactic his salary to be fixed by the Gen. Board.

Finance

The three years term of Mr. Courtney
expired March 1. His crop was poor last
year and he was not able to pay the rent
Jan 1, 1887 when it became due. By selling
one of his teams he reduced the note to about
\$800. He suddenly died in the early spring, &
the remainder of the property given him
by chattel mortgage has not all been disposed
of. It is probable that the University will not
realize enough from it to fully cover the note.
The deficit may be from \$750 to \$150
^{depending upon acreage, having for small farms at \$5.00 per acre,}
All the land held this year about 150
acres is rented for 1/3 crop rent, is being

Land Endowment:

The steady increase in value of the Land endowment, for the last 4 years has been encouraging. ^{Dept. Stewart} May predecessor in his last report named it as \$64,000. and showed that the income from it was between 1 & $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of that valuation. Three years ago it was valued at \$6,000 and one of the most successful business men in Ottawa, who had long lived here, expressed the opinion, ^{to year under} that it would be a wise measure for the Board to sell all except the Campus for that sum, and invest the money.

To day various opinions are expressed as to what the University may expect to realize from this division of lands. A large beautiful Campus of nearly 33 acres has been retained. The first addition including the Campus comprised $170\frac{1}{4}$ acres. That laid out this spring 99 acres.

The area between 13th street and ~~Mulberry~~,
and Mulberry, for 150 feet East of Mulberry, and the
West line of town is $183\frac{1}{2}$ acres. A little over $30\frac{3}{4}$ acres

In view of the fact that the lot of the Campus
there has been platted and made ready for sale
2 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres less the Campus 236 acres, leaving
371 acres in small numbers of the original section.
Of the first platting there remains unsold about 550
city lots and 21 of the larger lots. (The larger
lots are most of them the best desirable of the 64
larger lots that were laid out.) In both additions
there have been 1008 city lots and 64 larger lots.

The appraised valuation of the lots unsold East
of the Railroad is $\$34,503$. There are 144 lots
West of R.R., these at \$10 per lot would reduce the
valuation to \$33,945.

Our present Productive Endowment is \$46,916.37
Of this \$657.64 was reported last year as received
from other sources - leaving \$46258.73 already real-
ized net from sale of lots.

Price per Acre. Should the remaining lots be sold at
their appraised value. $\frac{46258.73}{82293.73} \times 100 = 55.94\%$ Current price of the 236
acres \$348.32 per acre.
