The Class Agent Program this year officially involves 20 classes dating as far back as 1913 and is ably chaired by Rev. James McCrossen (the class of '08 has conducted its own "campaign", too). This is an increase from last fiscal year when 7 classes participated. It is hoped that 13 - 15 additional classes (largely reunion year classes) can be added each year until the program is complete.

There has been good response in recruiting persons to serve as class agents and excellent letters are being drafted. Also, alumni who are contacted have been willing to become very personally involved, including providing much of the manual labor involved in the mailing process and adding personalized touches that are so beneficial.

The primary purpose of the Class Agent Program is to stimulate added involvement among alumni. Class Agents become well informed about University business and in turn pass that information on. Class Agents also stimulate giving percentages by the more direct appeals, based on personal knowledge of the majority of the recipients of their mail.
