- 1920 Born in Mission City, British Columbia, Canada where his father was a pastor. Born to Alfred Leonard Fredrikson and Elvira Michaelson Fredrikson.
- 1938 Graduated from Salem, SD High School
- 1938-1941 Attended Sioux Falls College, Sioux Falls, SD
- 1942 Graduated from Ottawa University, Ottawa, KS
- 1944 Married Ruth Beaver June 1, 1944
- 1944 Graduated from Central Baptist Theological Seminary, Kansas City, KS
- 1948 Received his BD from Andover Newton Theological Seminary, Newton, Mass.
- 1948 Ordained into the ministry at 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church, Andover, Mass.
- 1949 Received his STM degree from Andover Newton Theological Seminary, Andover, Mass.
- 1950 Began teaching at Ottawa University
- 1954 Became the Pastor at 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church, Ottawa, KS
- 1958 Received an Honorary Doctorate from Ottawa University
- 1959 Resigned as pastor of 1st Baptist Church, Ottawa, to become pastor of 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church Sioux Falls, SD
- 1960 Elected Vice-President of the American Baptist Churches USA
- 1970 Elected President of the American Baptist USA
- 1971 At the ABC Convention in Minneapolis, Fredrikson was made an honorary member of the Kiowa Tribe
- 1975 Accepted a call to the 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church of Wichita, KS
- 1987 Retired as pastor of 1st Baptist Church, Wichita, KS
- 1988 Moved to Sioux Falls, SD, where he still makes his home
- 2007 Inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame

Over the years Dr. Fredrikson has been involved in many activities that spread the Word and help humanity. Among these are: Baptist World Alliance, Habitat for Humanity, Renovare, an intra-church renewal movement to spread the Gospel, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Alcoholics Anonymous; the American Assembly at Green Lake Wisconsin, Faith at Work and multistate renewal conferences with various churches.

During his ministry in Sioux Falls he also hosted two TV programs called: A CUP OF COFFEE WITH ROGER and THE OPEN DOOR, with a Lutheran pastor and Catholic priest. During his ministry in Sioux Fall Dr. Fredrikson was also a leader in starting the Glory House, a halfway house for men and women coming out of prison, The Firehouse, an interfaith coffee house and worked in outreach with troubled teens.

Dr. Fredrikson has written four books: IT COST YOUR LIFE, GOD LOVES THE DANDELIONS, THE CHURCH THAT REFUSED TO DIE, and LEANING TO DANCE.
