

ALSO A MRS. E. R. NICHOLS

FORMER O. U. PROFESSOR MARRIED COLLEGE SWEETHEART
LAST JUNE.

Spent Their Honeymoon In the Michigan Woods—Now in Ripon, Wis.,
Where Professor is Teaching
English and Debate.

Prof. Egbert Ray Nichols, who was head of the English Department of Ottawa University last year, silently packed up his trunk, stole away and joined the benedicts.

Prof. Nichols was married June 16 to Miss Elsie Grace Stubbs of Franklin, Ind. The marriage was the culmination of a college romance that started while they were both attending Franklin College.

The wedding came as a surprise to many of the students of Ottawa University, and many little suspected that said Elsie Stubbs was the cause of the Professor's eastern trip at Christmas time. Prof. Nichols confided his joy to a few of his friends, then kept them "mum" on the subject.

Prof. Nichols left a large circle of friends both in Ottawa and among the students of O. U. He was admired as an instructor, and "made good" with the students as a friend. He was well known over Kansas, and his work as debate coach was the cause of no little favorable comment.

An interesting fact of the wedding is that the ceremony was performed by Dr. W. T. Stoot, who was president of Franklin College while Mr. and Mrs. Nichols were students there. In telling of the wedding, the Franklin Evening Star said:

"Prof. Nichols graduated with the degree of Ph. B., from Franklin College in 1907. He spent two years in Harvard University, and in the fall of 1909 he took the chair of English in Ottawa University. Prof. Nichols is a member of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity."

"Mrs. Nichols entered Franklin College from Chrisman, Ill. Later her parents took up their residence in the city. She finished her college course with the class of 1904, receiving the degree of B. A. She taught school at Dunkirk and the last year at Bloomfield. She is an alumnus of the Pi Beta Phi sorority.

"Prof. and Mrs. Nichols were very popular with the student body and have a wide acquaintance over the state by reason of this fact."

The newlywed Nichols spent their honeymoon camping at Beaver Lake camp on Lake Superior, near Munising, Mich. They went to Ripon, Wis., about August 15, and Prof. Nichols began his work as head of the English and Public Speaking Department of Ripon college, at the opening of the school year.
