A recent visitor to our campus noted the high level of morale of our students. We rejoice in this, for it indicated something of the good experience that students. are finding in being part of Ottawa University. A recent in-depth survey. conducted by our Resident Life Director, Fred Worsfold, gave statistical validation to this observation. We are proud of our student body and rejoice that they are having a sense of pride in who they are and in what Ottawa University is all about. Students come to us from all parts of the country and from many countries in the world. This provides an unusual opportunity for a student to experience a cross-section of our world today. Current events come alive as there is opportunity to discuss with Iranian students the meaning of the recent events in Iran. The same experience can be known with students from Central America, Europe, Asia, other countries of the Middle East and Africa as we are a cross section of our world. We also have healthy representation from different parts of the country and from many Christian denominations as well as a number of non-Christian religions. All of this makes for a campus that has a potential of being alive with meaning and filled with potential for learning, growth, and maturity.

The fact that these students are here is a tribute in the first instance to our excellent staff of Admissions Counselors. A further strong influence is the host of friends, alumni, and pastors who have made such strong response in supplying

us with lists of names of students they would like to see us contact in behalf of Ottawa University. Students are the reason why we exist and they are also the life blood of our institution. Help us to know names of those who ought to have the privilege of sharing in the life of Ottawa University!

Were you to be on the campus these days, you would note that we are well along in the improvements mandated by the Kansas Fire Marshall. Also you would see the steel skeleton frame of the new recreation building made possible by the meeting of the Mabee Foundation challenge last year. To all who shared in this experience, we extend again our hearty thanks.

We are making rapid strides toward a balanced budget. Even as we make these strides, it is not an indication that we are not in need of your continued stable and generous support. This year during which we are seeing so many good things happen here on campus, we will be enabled to see those good things happen only because we have continued to experience your generosity and your helpfulness. We trust that increasingly our expanding host of friends will take their places as those who regularly and faithfully undergird the important work here at Ottawa University, sensing the mission that is inherent in our purpose as an extension of the church. It was a genuine expression of love and commitment when many persons responded to the special emergency call of last year. It is also a very special kind of love and commitment that continues to be faithful and dependable in ways that make possible stabilization and strength.

The Resources Committee of our Board of Trustees has vigorous plans for the financial base of the University, including the rapid build-up of the Endowment Fund. Whether your giving is to the regular Annual Fund or to sources like the Endowment Fund, it will all contribute to strengthening our fulfillment of our mission as a liberal arts college in providing an education in the atmosphere of the Christian faith and values with a prime concern for each individual. This provides a unique blend found in only a few educational institutions.

I have a deep commitment to Ottawa University and a deep sense of confidence that as you and I and others join hands of support through finances, encouragement of students, prayers and speaking a good word for O.U. wherever we can, that we shall see a new day come to pass. It is obvious that one person does not bring in this new day nor does a staff of competent people. The new day comes when all of the human, financial, and spiritual resources of those of us on campus and at our Centers in Phoenix and Kansas City are joined by the dependable presence and support of you who are in our network of friends across the country and around the world.
