Last year she was a member of the team that tied for first place in the regional tournaments of both Kansas and Oklahoma. This year she went to the finals at Wichita in both debate and extempore. She is noted for beauty as well as for brains and last year was elected freshman queen at Southwestern. The Chicago Tribune, getting Witchita and Atlantic City confused, stated that she won a beauty contest at the Pi Kappa Delta convention! She speaks with such personality and charm that her hearers wonder that so much beauty and talent can be found in one small girl. This is the only reason judges ever give for voting against her. They have to believe their eyes, but can't believe their ears!

Evelyn Hunter is a freshman. She debated one year in high school, but has had much experience in all sorts of public speaking and dramatics. she is an "A" student and an ardent church worker. She speaks over two hundred words a minute and the court stenographer employed to take down the finals at Wichita gave up in despair and asked her to write out her speeches and send them in. Yet her audiences never lose a word she says. Her speaking is dynamic and magnetic. She is an example of the value of perseverance and hard work. She said recently, "I was in contests of all sorts for five years before I ever won a thing." Now she seldom loses and when her team lost the semi-finals at Wichita, she couldn't believe it. She was a member of the team that this year won for Southwestern the championship of the Kansas Intercollegiate Debating League.

Phyllis Burgess is a sophomore. In her high school days she took first in extempore in more than one tournament, won first in the inter-high school tournament at Southwestern and second in the state tournament. Last year she tied for first in debate in two regional Pi Kappa Delta tournaments and this year was a member of the teams that took the championship of the Kansas Intercollegiate Debating League. In debating she is as "hard as nails" and uses words "like bullets." Her forte is extemporaneous rebuttal. When her opponents at Wichita said, "Disarmament is a success in Urbania," she replied, "The argument is refuted by four considerations: 1st, Disarmament is not a success in Urbania, but a failure; 2nd, Urbania never disarmed; 3rd, Urbania never had any arms; 4th, There is no such country as Urbania!" She was an orator as well as debater in the national tournament.

As a sophomore—member of team that went to the finals at Tiffin, men's debate.


