The Danger of Being A Protestant

Introduction

Wrong

In 1517 - 444 years ago - late in October a German Monk named Martin Luther nailed 95 theses for debate and discussion to the Cathedral door in Wittenberg.

This was one of the sparks that ignited the fire of the Reformation.

Protestant

① Challenge the Unhikeness of the Middle Ages

Realities

- Sins of Greed.
 - Fees were charged for everything. Two burials without body.
 - Sale of Indulgences - Shorten time in purgatory.
 - Churchmen in Mass making money.
- Sins of Luxury and Pride
 - Churchmen lived in elegant homes with priceless pictures and books.
 - Carried in beautiful chairs.
- Sin of Magic in Religion
 - Lord's Supper became a charm.
 - One woman carried a piece of bread in her mouth, took it home and put it in beehive hoping for more honey.

② Deeper Question of Peace With God.

- Tried desperately to meet God's demands
- Fasted until cheeks caved in.
- Confessed sins for 6 hours at a time.
- Turned to Saints & Virgin Mary.
- But Then He Turned To Word of God.
- Filled with God With His Gifts of Faith.

Trial

Then the Trial at Worms Luther's Answer

"Since your Majesty and your Lordships ask for a plain answer, I will give you one without either horns or teeth. Unless I am shown by the Bible or reason, I neither can nor will take back anything. My conscience is a captive to the Bible, and I cannot go against conscience. God help me. Amen."

- The Imprisonment. Translation of Bible.
- His own Experience as Key.

And the Fires Had Been Lighted

① Zwingli and the Reformed Church.

- Use of Bible and simplification of Lord's Supper to Memorial Feast.

② The Anabaptists in Zurich, Switzerland

- Believed in no war.
- Questioned the baptism of infants.
- Separation of Church and State.

③ George Fox and the Quakers

- Would not take oath to any king or judge.
- His was a Religion of the Spirit - ^{Inner} Man.

④ John Wesley and the Methodists

- His heart was strangely warmed at Aldersgate.
- Note a horse 225,000 miles and as much as 90 miles in one day.
- Breached out of doors to 20 and 30 thousand people at a time.

- ⑤ William Booth and The Salvation Army.
- found the base in London's Slums
 - "In darkest England rather than Africa"
 - The curbstone became his pulpit.

The Great Spiritual Affirmations

① The Authority of The Bible

- Not the Church, But the Word of God.
- The Truth About God, Man and Salvation.
- The Key is Christ and the Interpretation of the Holy Spirit.

Dangers

- We do not use the Bible.
- We are not willing to be obedient to its Word.
- This is like discarding a Map.

② We Are Free Men

- Made in the Image of God.
- Depth Area Which Cannot be Coerced or Forced.
- Free to Go to Hell or Heaven.
- Freedom Can Only be Known in Obedience.

Dangers

- Free to run from Worship or from Discipline.
- Become a nation of Gluttons, Thieves and Cheats.
- Throw off Restraints, Worriers, families, Breakdowns or Alcohol.

③ We Are Justified By Faith, Not By Works

- Our Hope is the Grace of God.
- We can only grasp this by Faith.
 - Nothing in my hand & nothing,
 - I feel as I am.

Wangers

- Cheap Grace or Superficial bargain counter religion.
- We will settle for a little emotional jag.

④ The Church Is A Spiritual Fellowship

- Not An Organization, or an institution
- But Men and Women gathered by Christ.

Wangers

- Else this will become a horizontal, "do-good" fellowship.
- Else this will be a polite, nice group - nothing more or nothing less.

⑤ Every Man Is A Priest

- We go directly to God, No Mumbo jumbo at the altar.
- But every man is responsible to God.
- No double standards between us.

Dangers

- We will tire the preacher to take from religion.
- We will shrug off our responsibility.
