To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, and also for me, that utterance may be given me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains; that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

Dear friends, the few words that I share with you today grow largely out of my own experience of trying to be a Christian, with many ups and downs, many failures and now and then some small victories. I want to tell you how this came about, this week in taking Mr. Musto to the TV station, and as man y of you know Steve Musto is a likeable, outgoing song leader who directs the choir each night, a really wonderful fellow. A man by the way who is very humble, no pride in the sens that sometimes we have this. And he said how is the day going, and I said well it is a strange mixture Steve of a kind of frustration and joy, of course this has never happened to you. He said its strange that you should say that because I feel kind of badly myself, I just called home and my wife couln't speak for a few minutes because she was crying. He said you know we left home the first of January and we spent four m onths in Asia, then we were home a week, and then on the road again, then home, on the road again and she said Steve I'm lonely and I'm looking for you to come home, and sp he said I feel quite discouraged and low. And for just a minute standing in the TV station we had a prayer together. And then I though about all the fresh young people in this church who in the last several weeks, not just las week, but all through July it seems and now in August have made these eager wonderful decisions. And likewise some of you adults, mothers and dads, and this came home to be yesterday, the meaning of these decisions again so foreeably. Just yesterday, before lunch, and I count it the highest honor, as I know Dave and Dan do to sit with your young and try to instruct them as to how they ought to live as Christians. I count this among the highest of all the privileges, so eager and to hear their prayers is something that I wish everybody in the church could hear, said so honestly and as one girl said in her prayer in junior class, Lord this has been one of the greatest times I have ever had in the church. She is a girl who will be going into the fourth of or fifth grade this year. And then you wonder in this freshness, this first, love, this exciement and its a terrible thing to say but will they loose it, will I loose it, will there come over me a kind of coldness, deadness, will there come in the day after day living, letting myself sort of sink down, will there come a bordom, a lack of excitement about life that will be deadened. And then very strangly I found myself reading the scripture from the sixth chapter of Ephiseans which I think dear people we have to take very I don't thin that I seruiyskt,

can pick out the parts that I like and take those and say this is what I want and when some thing hits me in another place that I don't particularly like then I rationalize in some way and say this isn't exactly fitting and so I am not going to take this seriously. the matter is that this old Pro, if I can call him that, Paul, says wrestle not agains flesh and blood. My dear friends, something of the drag that I feel, and that you know I am certain is not just simply a dullness of personality it is the drag of evil on me. Why is it that when we try to pray it is so easy it seems to let the mind just wander all over the place, why do we go to sleep, why do we find it sometimes so much easier to close ourselves, we have said over and over again I am going to be open and loving and then we just close up, and then we turn on ourselves and become angry in the way we have been. Why is it we can find it so casual and flip at the time when we really ought to be coming into the depth of our own decisions, why is it like this. I am inclined to take Paul with terrible seriousness, that I do not from day to day in my own life wrestle just against flesh and blood but against principalities and power of high places. There is that mystery, that power, which if he could would lay hold on my life so that I would live more by mistrust than by trust, more by hatred than love, more by being closed than by being open. Dear friends, something of the agony of the wordd is this drag on life, this enslavement. Take for example one of our national news magazines this week, writing on theMafia, its a frightening story, thirty billion sucked out america, conservatively, assets greater than the nine greatest corporations in America, running all the way from U. S. Steel to Crystler Corporation, conservatively five to seven billion dollars profits in a year. Is this some manifestion of a mystery, that runs through the blood of life that is like a great evil, what is there behind the scenes that somehow on one had we long for peace and yet there is, there seems almost a drive to make war, to express our hostility. Why is it that in a community like ours, coming right down where we live, on one night two hundred and sixty eight young people, for better or worse say I am going to walk down there and at least try to say something that the man is calling me to, maybe it is Christ that has done the calling and the next night, somebody smashes up one of And if I do not understand somehow the conflict, the struggle, our schools. What is there? the anguish within myself which manifests itself, both in good and evil, both in God and satan, so that I struggle to give myself to a single mastry, more on some days than on other days

surely let us thank God for this, if not this being some kind of enlargement of that struggle that is within me. And when I stand it seems tettering on the edge of something new, it is then that the doubts come, then the fears come, it is then that something comes to me and says Oh its not important. Let me illustrate this. Mr. White when talking to the ministers talked very softly and tenderly, the best talk that I have heard him give, he told about when he was working for his PH D at Oxford, five years he struggled to get his thesis done on the ecumentical movement, tracing its beginnings, its origins, in those five years there was a terrific struggle to get this done, and finally he said because my writing was inadquate, my major prof kept shoving the paper back and saying it isn't right, I found myself tettering on the verge of a nervous breakdown and outside of church, riding down the narrow streets of Oxford in one of those great old historic colleges, there is a big door with burning left from centuries ago in its innards but on the outside of the door a cross, and White said in that moment, like a stop light God spoke to me, and I knew what had happened to me was in the years of study and struggle my devotional life had gotten barren and thin and I was almost bankrupt within myself. I went to my room and made a vow, that he said I propose to keep either until I die or till Christ comes again, that is that I will give one hour a day to an appointment that I have with God. There wamn't a pastor that sat there, I know because I talked to them afterwards who did not sense something of the breakdown of his own devotional life, the carelessness To pick the day up and rush into it helter, sclter, trying to get with which we live. ahold of this and get ahold of that, and pettering out before noon has come and having succomb to a power that is negative and evil that will take over if there is not the power of Christ that lives within us. Jesus told once a frightening story of a house that had gotten cleaned of one devil and while it stood there empty and vacant, seven devils moved into the vacum and took over, the place that had at one time only had one devil, the meaning of it is that you cannot have within life a vacum, there either stands the force of the Spirit that is of Christ, that guids me, or there is a force of evil that tears me, frustrates me, until it becomes a massive confusion and I do not mean to over simplify this for the discouragement of a Steve Musto and in a sense saying I think I will give up and go home for the frustration of an instiution can make you so

disgusted with the church that in the end you say it isn't worth it. If you take this and follow it to its logical extreme, but you see the great thing that needs to be said, and I hope that every junior high here understands this because some of you are in the class and it is - I will give you an armor, I will guard you, and I will care for you. he takes this, the old concept of the armor which the Romans wore, truth, rightousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the word of god like a sword. No man stands alone. We have sort of jokingly at times sung and yet we have sung it with deep feeling and sincerity, an old gospel hymn and it came about believe it or not because when we had finished a mission in Alexandria, Minnesota in April, John Swanson the minister, we had had moving and unexpected commitments in the service, John Swanson said I would like us to sing an old hymn, it was the last hymn that we sang, that I used to sing as a boy back in my church in Chicago and we started to sing, asked the pianist if she could play it and so without any music we took off "No Never Alone". He has promised never to leave me alone and as we got in the car to drive home, the five of us. One of us said I used to stand by the radio in my kitchen and hear that song come over the radio station and I would cry because I felt I was all alone and now thank God, this person said I know that I am not alone. So we sang it intermittently all most all the way and sometimes laughing and etc. from And yesterday at the close of a prayer group in which Minnesota down to South Dakota. we had a marvelous sense of God's presence, someone said lets sing it and I tell you however young or old you are, the battle is really not yours it is God's and if somehow I dare drink of this resources and open my life to the possibility of what he can give me he will guard me and take me forth to victory. I rejoice in these days as many of you do, I have visited with some of you personally about your decisions, they have been profound and meaningful, but may I hasten to tell you this is only the beginnings. If in our days to day living as a congregation we can sustain each other, hold each other up, share each others woes and joys, drink of each others lives, then the wonder of what Paul says in the end, put on the whole armor of God, will become something we share in together as God's
