Kemp, Robert L. *Assignment: Directing the School's Forensic Program*. Sarasota, FL.: College Publications Center, 1988.

Kennedy, George A. *Aristotle on Rhetoric: A Theory of Civic Discourse* N.Y. and Oxford: Oxford University Press, 1991. **This is the latest, fullest, and probably best translation of Aristotle's Rhetoric.**

Kruger, Arthur N. *Argumentation and Debate: A Classified Bibliography*. 2nd ed. Metuchen, N.J.: Scarecrow Press, Inc., 1975. **This is the place to find everything about forensics before JAFSA. This is THE SOURCE for information on argumentation, debate, and forensics in the 1940's, 1950's and 1960's. **

McBath, James, ed. *Forensics as Communication: The Argumentative Perspective*. Skokie, IL.: National Textbook Company, 1975. **This is the first and best forensics development conference. This text is critical for philosophy of forensics and perspectives on being a forensics educator.**
