"Ottawa University bears its share of the growth and problems of higher education. . . .

The enrollment last fall was 716 and it is expected that it will be 760 next September.

Present plans suggest a 1,000 enrollment by 1970 or before. That will depend on development of proper housing. . . .

"The University has a sound program already in operation as a base of expansion. The strong faculty will need a few additional members. The classrooms, labs and library with minor changes are adequate for 1,000 students. . . .
