Whereas the Ottawa Indians,
in the State of Kansas, set apart
under Treaty made between them
and the United States in 1862,
15,000 acres of their choice lands
as an endowment for the Otta-
wa University under the man-
agement of the Baptist Denomin-
ation, said Treaty making it ob-
ligatory on the Trustees of the Uni-
versity to invest all money's receiv-
ed from the sale of said lands on
Bond and Mortgage in Franklin
County in the State of Kansas:

And whereas the sum of
\$11,000. has been received from the
sale of a portion of said lands, and
not invested as required by the
Treaty, it is now necessary to raise
immediately by subscriptions the
said \$ 11,000. and to place the same
on Bond and Mortgage as required
by the Treaty in order to secure the

remaining 12,000 acres and the
University building which are now
worth at least \$120,000.

Therefore we the undersigned,
do, in consideration of the above
facts, promise to pay to the Treas-
urer of the Ottawa University the
sums set against our respective
names on or before the 15th of
March, 1868
