Proposed Constitutional Amendment

503 Each undergraduate chapter, to maintain itself in good standing, shall provide itself with a constitution, shall meet regularly, shall initiate new members at least annually using an appropriate obligation and ceremony, shall report new members and changes in standing of members to the National Secretary-Treasurer, and shall collect membership fees, national chapter fees, and other assessments of the National Organization promptly and forward them to the National Secretary-Treasurer or attend the National Convention at which time these fees may be paid. All treasurers who are sending money for fees or keys must designate the person or persons for whom the money is being sent.

Attendance at a National Convention 503.1 shall be defined as answering present to roll call at not less than two business sessions of the convention. One of these sessions must be the final session unless the chapter has been excused by the National President from this final session.

504 Undergraduate chapters shall be placed on probation by the Charter and Standards Committee if the following conditions exist.

504.1 Any undergraduate chapter not submitting five new members every biennium for a four year period or not paying the annual national chapter fee for a four year period shall be placed on probation.

504.2 An undergraduate chapter placed on probation by the National Convention for any cause shall be deprived of all privileges of membership except for the initiation of new active members, and shall have no vote in the Province or National Organization.

504.3 Probationary status can be removed upon certification by the Charter and Standards Committee that al! deficiencies have been removed.

505 Any undergraduate chapter not submitting five new members every biennium of the six year period or not paying the annual national chapter fee for the six year period shall forfeit its charter upon recommendation of the National Council and approval by the National Convention.

Proposed Amendments must reach Tony Allison, the Secretary-Treasurer or Gary Horn. Constitutional Revision chairperson by October 15 in order to be forwarded to The Forensic office by November 1 in order to be printed in the Winter edition which will be mailed prior to Thanksgiving that it may reach the chapters before Christmas break.

Pi Kappa Delta wishes to express to the close friends and relatives of Jerry Haggard our deepest sympathy over his death. Jerry evidenced honesty and sincerity as well as intelligence and wit in his interaction with others. His personality and positive approach to life made him a valued part of every group of which he was a member.

Pi Kappa Delta has lost the future contribution of a young man who demonstrated well our motto. Whether seeing him in action in a committee meeting, encountering him in a debate or merely observing him at a social occasion, you always were aware that he was skilled in "the art of persuasion, beautiful and just."




PROVINCE LEADERS FEATURED




