Flight To Hawaii

The thrill of a lifetime was afforded two Colorado A & M College debaters in March when they represented the College in a series of debates in the Hawaiian Islands, under the auspices of the University of Hawaii.

Kenneth Iverson of Adams City, Colorado, and Rod Wilson of Fort Morgan, Colorado, were selected by the A & M debate club to participate in the week-long series in the land of flowers.

The Coloradoans went from Fort Collins to San Francisco by train. Arriving in the Golden Gate City on Sunday morning they spent the day sightseeing and resting. That evening they boarded a plane which landed them in Honolulu a scant 9 hours later.

At the Honolulu airport they were greeted by a bevy of hula dancers and by Wayne O. Fox, professor of speech at the University of Hawaii.

The debate series started shortly thereafter at the University. The topic

for the first debate was "Resolved: That Hawaii should become a commonwealth." The Coloradoans took the affirmative while Muneto Yamamoto and Wildred Lee spoke on the negative. The mainlanders won this verbal tussle and Wilson was chosen as the most effective speaker of the debate.

Following the debate at the University and a brief look at Honolulu's night life, Iverson and Wilson accompanied by Mr. Fox and Stanley Reynolds and Wilfred Lee from the University of Hawaii flew to the neighboring island of Maui for a series of informal debates before high school audiences.

The first one was held at Baldwin high school before a record audience of more than 1,200 students. This was just an exhibition and no winner was determined.

Immediately following this they put on another exhibition at St. Anthony's high school with an audience of 700 in attendance. Later that afternoon Iverson and Wilson were guests at a radio station where they recorded a broadcast which was played that evening.

An interesting sidelight of the trip to Maui was the torrential rain which fell during the Coloradoans' visit. More than 11.1 inches fell in a 10 hour period.

The following day (Wednesday) an exhibition debate was held for the speech department of Maui high

school followed by another exhibition at Lahainaluna school, one of the few self-supporting schools in the world.

Their tour of Maui ended, the boys returned to Honolulu where they took part in an exhibition Thursday as part of the Pacific speech festival. The University was represented by Elaine Ah Mai and Etsuo Shigezawa. The topic was "Resolved: That the United States should limit its defense commitments to the Western hemisphere."

Following the festival the visitors were treated to a performance of a Japanese play and a tour of Waikiki.

Friday morning they were again treated to a tour of Honolulu and they made a recording for one of the Honolulu broadcasting stations. That afternoon a debate was held for Honolulu high school students with Lilly Miyamoto and Charles Char representing the U. of H. The topic was the defense question.

The final debate of the series was held Friday night on the commonwealth question. Masaru Funai and Shunichi Kimura were Hawaii's representatives on this topic. The Hawaiians were declared winners in

this meet. Masaru and Shunichi are at present on a tour of the mainland.

Following the strenuous but enjoyable series Iverson and Wilson




spent Friday night and Saturday visiting friends, shopping and swimming. They were the houseguests of Mr. and Mrs. F. T. Cummings, parents of one of their fellow students at Colorado A & M.

Sunday morning they were given a big send-off at the Honolulu airport and were once more winging their way across the blue Pacific. After spending a day in San Francisco they boarded a train for the last lap of their journey.


