

And while we deny that the Ottawa Indians have any rights or equities in Ottawa University other than the education of their children as presented by Treaty. Yet at the same time if we are willing to pay said Indians such a sum ~~as~~ in such a manner as may be determined by the Commission named in the present Senate Bill 1290 in view of their educational interests said sum to be determined upon the basis of so much of the Appraisal of the late Commission as refers to the 20640 acres which were donated or set apart by said Indians for educational purposes and the proceeds arising from the sale of any portion of the same as made by us. We agree to the above with this reservation that said Commission can be appointed & appraisal made and settlement with the Indians upon the Constitution ~~and~~ not involving the property of the University or the members of the Board hereafter.
