All the way through this book we run into the word thanks and it is not a superficial casual kind of thing, it is a deep profound reality. You see we have many many different ways that we say thaks, we say it because it is expected, we say thanks because it is a custom but it is never that way in the scriptures. It is thanks born of grace. I have a debt that I can't pay and yet you have allowed me to say thanks sir and so I do it. I will never forget hearing Geurt say when I got up from my knees I just simply said thank you sir. That is the kind of thanks that you run into here. People are so full of joy they can't get it into words. They try to sing it, they try to dance it, because they know the goodness of God. People find themselves like Paul and Silas in a jail and at midnight they are singing and in th singing there is thanks. I could not help, my mind just kept going to it and so I felt I was kind of hung with it, this account of Jesus the night of his betrayal. Amazing that in this time he should take a cup and say Thanks. You see most of us would have been trying to figure how to get out of this, this terrible jame, the smell of death was out on the streets and here we was with a little group and they had eaten together and now he says I want to give you the bread and I want to give you the cup but before I do I was to says thanks. There is a sense in which all of life gets you ready for those kind of mements. You see when the squeeze is on if I can put it that way, there may be people here today that feel in your hearts that all of life has tumbled in on you, there is a quiet desparation, no one cares, I am ready to check out and go home because my grades are lousy, I thought I was going to have a lark but it hasn't worked out that way. A hundred different things you can feel within yourself. How in the world can you say thanks in the middle of that? Yet all of his life this is what Jesus Children, thanks, food, thanks, fantastic thing that he should did.

when he was feeding the five thousand he should take the fish and he could lift up his head and because this was sacred, bread was never a thing to be violated with Jesus. and he said thanks. So it was natural when he came to the end, in this terrible moment of agony which we call the passion which we meditate on not just during a week but over and over and over again that he should take in that mo-ent and sing with them and then say thanks. I want us by the grace of God to somehow become like that. Death may be here, lonliness, I see our brother Gene Christopherson, he and his wife almost killed this week on a bridge when someone drove on their side of the road, right into the car. When he spoke to the men on Friday he said it was thanks that we gave to God. I thought about this, why did jesus say thanks with these men that he was gathered with that night. And you start to pull at different things that come at you, just the fact of food and drink. Before he gave them the bread that way and said, do this in rememberance of me, they had eaten and drunk together. That is something to be grafeful for. I don't know how we can cut life down to the simplicity of just what it means to have bread. You see our lives get so stuffed up and full of all kinds of junk that it is hard to get down to the simplicity, down to fact that just to have a glass of milk and bread doew not mean that I am cursing someone else because I don't have more but to say thanks for what I do have. You see what we need to understand is that because some of us dared to throw a dollar or two on a plate some time ago for Pakistan somebody will sit and eat rice tomorrow or today and will eat something, one meal and there may be heard running through that camp, thank you Lord, thank you. Man lets walk out of here today and do it here. Lets walk out of here and say I thank you for the simplicities of life. Jesus lived his whole life that way. The little things, the bird the star, the bit of food, the child, the old person. Thank you.. But he was also Thankful, I am convinced that these men were here. They were his friends, he knew

everyone of them, like you know the palm of your han d. Think of Judas for three years Jesus had pulled and yanked at him and tried somehow to break through and Judas kept glancing off like he was shadown boxing and now the thing that he says, I am convinced, about Judas is not anger it is not said coldly, there is passion in it, the man that is going to betray me is in this room, yet I am convinced with all that is within me that he thanked God for all of them. Peter, they were all going to run. Lets not try to hold each other up and make more of each other than we are. Everone of us has clay feet, everyone of us here at a point can let the other fellow down, but the marvel is that ₹=say=t= you and say to each other, I need you, I want you, I love you, we are friends. If I were to start a list, just like you, of people who in the last twelve months who have been deeply a part of my life in the most unexpected places, all the way from taxicabs to someone sitting in a corporation office/ All the way across that to say that I am not greatful for this is a travisty. So Jesus said, thanks and

I am going to ask u s to do something here that is a little unusual but I want to underline this. I would like every person here to thank God in his depths for the person on his right and the person on his left. I my case this will be Linda and it will be Vic. If you do not know the person on your left or right ask him or her what their name is. Will you do that now. So much that I want to say about this, but I can't, the time you know. But I hope people listen wherever they are, that we want to be their friends. Even Judas. You know Jesus was thankful for his people, his history. I could spend the rest of the day on this. What does it mean to be a part of the people. Somehow within Jesus and you know how I emphasize Sunday after Sunday that this is the savior the son of God, the Lord of history.

I am convinced that the thanked God the Father for these men.

Deep, deep in Jesus veins there was Jewish blood, never forget that. Hook nose, perhaps an ugly man in some ways and against the backgroun of that night was twenty five hundred or more years of history-. call of Abraham, the rebellion of the people, the moving in captivity, the covenent, the blood on the door post, the pass over feast that had been celebrated over and over again, the stuborness that he ran into. The rejection because they wouldn't have him. Yet he loved them, he wept over them and the agone of his people was on his back and in his heart, he came it is said to save and to seek his own. But his own wouldn't have him. But yet he thanked God for this. Let everyone of us thank God for our people. The kome out of which we were born. Even if your home broke up and got divided, the life anyhow, the experiences the people who have touched your life, the story of your own life, all of this is a part of what you are. The troubles that you have had along the way as well as the lift and the hope. brokenness as well as the wholenss, grows out of the fact that I have my soil, my roots with a people, I am deeply conscious of this in this country. I am aware of the fact that we committ many sins, we have analized ourselves backwards and forwards and up and down until we almost have a desperate kind of inferiority complex. But I cannot forget th fact that we are the emergence in a sense of a great many strands of people, who found each other in an incredible dream, offcasts, people that didn't amount to anything, sat in jails and came and found themselves starting something in Georgia or Virginia. With all of our sins and wrong doings we are a people. I know that this can be said with idolotry but I say it with gratitude and we need to affirm each other and find each other with gratitude. When mrs. McElany stood up and told us with such tenderness and love, do not forget that she said, I want to speak of what the red man has given the white man, that is part of it. is a great hunk of what we are. Thank God that she had the courage in her heart to say, in spite of the suffering of her people, now let

speak a little bit of what the white man has given to the red man.

And in the end she read that incredible statement by Chief Journeycake
You have made us walk, we have died in the cold winters and all the
rest, but you have given to us the story of God. This is the people
of which we are a part. Affirm it in some sense, pray for the healing
of the people, the newness of the people, as Jesus not only longed and
prayed for the Jew but for all people. Thank God for the roots which
are a part of us.

Now I come to the last and in some ways the most difficult thing to say. How can I speak of this, that Jesus should take his own cup and know exactly that he belong there. This was no accidnet that he had come to Jeruselem, this whole thing that he had tried to live out for thirty to thirty three some three=years of life, among these people, with the destiny of being the savior of the world was not something that just happened to spin So that when you come to the table and if something esut== of this off. could be in our thanksgiving table, it would be an incredible Thursday that we would celebrate. The purposes of God were in that little room and as Jesus took bread and broke it, took the cup and poured it he spoke of of a covenent that this God is making with you. A newness that wants to break forth, a life that can only come as the grace of my own life is poured out. This week in a packing house, Vic and I went to visit together, to somehow get the touch and the feel of the people who work there. We need to know and understand where you are The work that you do. I think what sometimes happens to us as pastors is that we sit in the studies and we sort of work on our nice theories and we shoot off in the vacume someplace and I want to say and I hope you will not take it as a vulgarity, as I watchedd animals being killed and let us not dodge this, Jesus said, my blood is the seal of the new covenent. The deepest thanks of Christ himself are at that point. For somehow the giving of himself becomes the

manifestation of Gods grace and in that manifestation comes the new possibility of salvation for all man kind so that as we taste of that grace ourselves we drink of that cup, we know the meaning of salvation of wholenss and of newness which only he can give. that can break forth out of all of us. Grace can be released. Friends la have to ask you today, how deep does your thanks run? When death comes at you ad the doctor says you have months, if you are given that long, will you dare say thanks because I know you are here. When it seems that you stand alone and God knows at times we need to stand alone, dare I say You see with all the joy that we will have on Thursday, thanks. Thanksgiving, family gatherings, turkey and all the rest, I beg you not to loose the importance of Thanks when it is hitched to grace. The Eating of the Bread

There is a deep hope and prayer in our lives that the central act of this service will not be the spoken word but the act of taking bread and drinking of the cup. I hope in the sense that all that takes place in this serfvice is a preparation for that which is so central to our faith. I must confess to you that in the years that have come and gone I have groped myself to really lay hold on what it means that we should centuries after a young man stood in an upper room, with a small band and took what was so simple and soprofound and I must confess that I end up walking around it and looking at it, but most of all I understand in my own heart and life what it is all about. On this advent communion it seemed right to leave the candles in their place on this communion table. I wonder if those of you who are visiting realize that the pulpit furniture, much of what we have in the church has been given to us, was made by a loving family Just like people prepare candles and given to us by the Harold Larsens. and make decorations and bring in trees and get music prepared that it should be a gift offered to God. So we went down stairs and got the old table, its almost too small for the elements, the plates and the cups, this communion table that many of you here will remember from back in Ciţ With it one senses some of the history of what this is all about. So then we said to our deacons, why don't you come on the platform and face the people like good deacons should. Let me say that in many many black churches they sit every sunday morning and face the congregation. These men and the women who have prepared the elements, who will be going out this afternoon to take the communion to the shut ins and the people who cannot be here or who are with us now by radio in many cases represent I say it unsashambediy in part of the leadership of this congregation. accordance with the book of Acts the deacons are to be of good reputation they are to be wise and they are to be full of the Holy Spirit. And as we prepared oiurselves to serve the supper we ask that our hearts may be prepared that way. Now we have layed hold on a magestic scripture for this Advent season. It comes out of Gods dealings with the people of Israel but more specifically with a man called Moses. Back and forth there is conversation, God knows that he will use Moses to deliver his people. I can only go into this in a very very short way. It is an old magestic powerful story and what we do today is routed in it. So after the first scirmish with Pharoh, Moses complains to God. He did that like we do. You know, God you have just got me into a mess. I went to him and nothing happened. And then he says you don't understand Moses, I am going to bear my arms and before I get through you are going to know what this represents. It represents the bearing of Gods arm. The phrasology that comes through is powerful, we are going to read it later, as folks who ar to be received by the right hand of fellowship stand before us. Listen tp words like released from labors, rescue you from slavery, redeem you with arm outstreached and then this phrase, adopt you as my people. I will become your God. Some of you in this santuary have a deep sense of graditude in your hearts because the child or children that came your way were adopted. Where would that child have been if you had not taken the child? The people of Israel had become in a sense no accounts, they were off scouring, they felt the whip on their back and they had to build cities and they were ashamed and a disgrace. Years came and went and they wondered if anybody heard their agony. Not unlike the thing that I hope some of us felt in Hugh Smith last week. He talked about those countless thousands coming down out of China into Hong Cong. I shall never forget, you have heard me speak of it, but I do it again, when we in 1947 at the first meeting of young people gathered after the war, said there is a new nation, it is called the nation of the displaced person, but I Fef prefer to call it delayed pilgrims. This is what the stuff of Israel was and yet long before God had said you are going to be a people, he had said it to Abraham, he said it to Abrahams son and to his sons, but here h they were, now he says to them I will adopt you as my people and = you will And to commemorate this convenant, to enter into its renewal be my God. you will eat a supper, we call that the pass over meal. And every time a

Jewish people gather in a home during their passover time to take bread, to take hems and they remall the passing through the wilderness, the revealing of Gods mighty arm in the plagues and finallyPharoh says Get out Most of all they celebrate the fact that they are a people. There cam centuries later a young many who was full of all of that, all of promises of God, he knew and understood, in that upper room he said I make with you a new covenent. The release will not only be physical, it will not only be an outer thing and it will not be based on your race for this now becomes an open covenent with anyone who will have it, and in the magnificance of Jesus ministry I hope we know and can catch that nkind of ministry and that style of life. Jesus who said, you can't really undestand what this is all about unless you become a kind of no account. It is hard for us sophisticated surburbanites to understand. So much of our life is spent playing games. Thow can I admit that I am playing game that I am am maimed and blind, how can I admit that I a lost coin or a lost boy, how can I admit that I am in need of a physician. He said I came not for those who know they are well, but those who know they are sick and yet the esssence of the gospel is our becoming like children, it is becoming poor in Spirit, I cannot take the bread and cup and enter into the presence of God on my own preoggeratives. I cannot convince him how worthwhile I am, this is why to really celebrate this day out of this verse, this statement of God to Moses is I have been adopted. why Paul says once those of you who are afar off have been brought near, you now belong, not in some superficial way to the people of God, you are the people of God, the way is open and this is why Peter says when he writes to the people that he was writing to in exile, he says to them once you were no people, now you are Gods people, a royal priesthood, a friendly nation, called out of darkness into light. That is what we celebrate today. Someone told me between services that they had given a friend a gift, the gift was a clip, a fish, to put on to hold the necktie in place. How remarkable that this person should catch as a birth gift the sense that

Jesus Christ is Lord and know that he belongs like all the rest of us. Friend, it needs to be said so often, because so many people come Sunday after Sunday seeking, I wish you only knew and understood, those of us who think we are the respectable ones. I need to say this with all that is within me. You may have come today berefted of strength, you may hav come feeling that I do not belong. All of my life I have been like a kid with my nose against the glass, wanting to get in where the feast is but I can't get in. The world is full of people like that, some of them drive big cars, presumably have all of the things that they want and there are the dispossed, you may feel that way weven though your skin is white. But there are the peoples of the world who in a sense cry out and say I wamt to be in, I want to belong. Communion as we break bread and share the cup communion says in Christ Jesus brother or sister, you and I belong together and if that is true, then for Gods sake lets not clutch it to our breasts and go around like we have some private possession about it. Lets understand that the magnificance and wonder of this is that we can share the way is open and in the deepest greatest sense evangilism is that we can let people know that. Not just because we ram it at them, but because in some sense we say can I help you. Not because of what I am going to get out of you, but because I want to give you a chunk of myself. Man I have been accepted, I have been set free and because I have been accepted and set free I just want to tell youthat the name of God is Jehovah, he is my God and your God and better than that his name is Jesus for he shall save his people from their sins. So when God says to Moses I will adopt you as my people and I shall be to you your god let that be the promise that we find fulfilled today as we eat and drink together.

Let me say it to you very briefly and to the point. Christnas is about a name, not just any old name, but a name, the name,. You shall call his name Jesus for he shall take the sins of his people away. Emanuel, God with us. That is my name, I have heard the graaning of my people, all my people, black and red, Russians and Americans, Chinese, Africans, all of them. am about to do a great thing through one whose name is Jesus. is his name. How will you speak it in your home this Christmas. We know that name is spoken in ulgarity in the streats, it can be spoken in joy on the streets too. We know that when men curse they use that name, but that name can also become a name of blessing, not just because

we speak it with our lips, but because we live it with our lives. I had not known until I sat down and entered into this worship with you that the last anthem lifted up is all Hail the Power of Jesus Name, let angels prostrate fall. What an incredible thing that with the angels and all the hosts we can declair that name, we can live it, because that one who is the Lord God says I am Jehovah, but more than that has said I am Jesus. So let that name ring among us, let us rejoice in it for his sake and the sake of the world. Amen.
