1916-17.Meeting of the Faculty of Ottawa University, Sept. 11, 1916.

Opened with prayer by the President.

Members present: Rice, Wilson, Hardy, Kingsbury, Grover, Ritchie, Higgins, McClain, Bollen, Schabinger, Stansell, and Missen. Pischer, Brown, Thielor, Kline and Stallard.

Minutes of the last meeting read and approved with corrections.

Statements by the President in reference to ideals of college and instruction.

Announcements in reference to registration by Dean Hardy and Miss Brown.

Voted on motion of Props. Hardy and Wilson that certain changes in the schedule be approved.

Discussion of the chapel hour.

Voted on motion of Props. Hardy & Grover that Verne Gambrell, ineligible for reenrollment according to catalogue rule A p. 26, be readmitted.

The case of Mr. Kaylor who desired 1 unit credit in Expression was referred to the department of Public Speaking and the Registration Committee with power to act.

On motion of Props. Hardy and Wilson it was voted to accept $\frac{1}{2}$ unit of methods and $\frac{1}{2}$ unit of management offered by Mr. Robertson of the Helena High School.

It was voted on motion of Prop. Hardy to revise Catalogue rule 3 p. 25 to read as follows:

"When the number of unexercised absences of a student in any subject exceeds one-tenth of the total number of recitations in that subject for the semester, he will be dropped from the course. He may be reinstated only by faculty action

On motion of Prof. Higgins and Kingsbury it was voted to appoint a committee of three including the Dean to report at the next meeting on the matter of student applications for advanced standing. Profs. Hardy, Kingsbury and Ritchie were appointed.

Meeting of the Faculty of Ottawa University, September 15th 1916.

Opened with prayer by Prof. Ritchie.

Members present: Price, Groner, Hardy, Wilson, Higgins, Ritchie, Kingsbury, Ballin, McClain, Stansell, Misses Pischer, Brown, Kime, Streator, Stallard.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Dean Hardy reported informally for the Registration Committee. Also that the Committee on advanced standing would report at the next regular meeting.

The case of Mr. Ralph Bower, ineligible for readmission to the college, was discussed. Mr. Bower appeared before the Faculty and stated that it was his purpose to devote more time to his studies and to make better grades than last year.

Voted on motion of Profs. Hardy and Ballin that Mr. Bower be enrolled for 10 hrs, and if at mid-semester he is not making a grade of B in 8 hrs and passing in 15, he be automatically dropped.

The following requests for excess work were granted:

The request of Miss Grace Powell to be allowed to take Short Hand & Typewriting in addition to 13 hrs was referred to Dean Hardy & Miss Krine. (Request then withdrawn.)

Also, Hist of Miss Ruth Phillips referred to Misses Pirscher, Stallard and Dean Hardy. (Withdrawn.)

The requests of Misses Hornfeld and Elsie Munst to take Hist. of Education out of class on account of conflict with Chem. Ia, were referred to the Registration Com. and Prof. Brown & Klingenberg. The request of Miss Gertrude Mayer to take Eng. XI out of class on account of a conflict was granted.

Of Mr. Albert Johnson for 18 hrs. referred to the Dean with power to act.

The requests of Misses Velva Brown and Lois Berkeley to be excused from Ethics on account of conflict with Histology, and that of Mr. Alfred Miller on account of conflict with Physics, were granted.

There followed general discussion of Admission requirements.

Minutes of the last meeting were
read and approved.

Prof. Ritchie, Secy of the Committee on
Advanced Standing reported progress.
The Committee was continued.

Voted on motion of Profs. Wilson and
Kingsbury that present Juniors and Seniors
be not required to take Physical Training.
(Interpreted to mean one year of P. T. for
present Sophomores.)

Dean Hardy presented the case of Mr.
Chestnut who had been provisionally en-
rolled ^{as a Freshman} with acceptable units, the others
being vocational.

Voted on motion of Profs. Hardy & Groner that
the provisional enrollment of Mr. Chestnut
be approved.

Voted on motion to allow Mr. Merrill Duback
to take 18 hours of college work.

Dean Hardy introduced the question of chapel absences,
and recommended in the form of a motion, that 8 chapel
excess, in the college, be counted toward the number
of absences from class now involving a penalty.
And in the Academy that this excess be distributed
among the studies in Alphabetical order.

The following substitute motion was accepted: That the
penalty for chapel absences be applied when the number
equals the number of hours for which the student
is registered, including ^{chapel and} gymnasium work.

On motion of Profs. Wilson and Groner it was voted
to refer this matter back to the Committee to report
at the next meeting of the Faculty.

Voted on motion of Miss Brown and Prof. Kingsbury that students Academy and College be required to occupy seats assigned them or be counted absent.

Special Meeting of the Faculty of Ottawa University, Tuesday, Oct. 17 1916.

Opened with prayer by the President.

Present: Messrs Price, Groner, Hardy, Wilson, Higgins, Kingsbury, M.E. Clain, Stansell, Misses Fischer and Brown.

Purpose of the meeting a consideration of the case of Mr. Cowle, presented by Prof. Wilson.

Change of Reg. Foot-ball Eligibility. Rule waived. Mr. Cowle was ineligible for foot-ball for two weeks on account of a change in registration after Oct. 1, involving the 12 hour requirement.

Voted on motion of Prof. Wilson and Hardy that the rule in its application to next Friday's game be waived.

Voted on motion of Prof. Hardy and Groner that requirement in reference to Physical Training be suspended in the cases of Messrs L. Thomas and F. Morgan. Morlan

Phys. Cult. Reg. in Academy. Voted on motion of Miss Brown and Professor Hardy that the graduation requirement in Physical Culture in the Academy shall be two years.

President Price read two letters, one from Pres. Thomas of Bryn Mawr College, the other from Miss Cordia Hubert a graduate student of the same school with reference to the latter's securing an A.M. degree from Ottawa for graduate work in Bryn Mawr. These letters were to be considered later.

the following regulation voted: In the college unexcused ab-
sences in excess of 8 shall be counted toward the number of un-
excused absence for which 1 hr. of col. credit is deducted from
the student's record.

In the Academy unexcused absence in excess of 8 shall
be distributed in alphabetical order among the sub-
jects which the student is carrying.

1916-17. Dean Hardy introduced the following to be
published in the catalogue:
"Physical Culture two hours per week is re-
quired of all Freshmen, Sophomores and Acad-
emy students."

Adopted on motion of Prop. Hardy and Brown.
Also, the following as matter of record:
This requirement may be deferred by consent
of the Dean of the College or Principal of the Acad-
emy, but two years of Phys. training shall be re-
quired for graduation from the Academy, and
two years from the College.

Voted on motion of Misses Brown and Shuster that the requirement of Commercial ^{Geography} $\frac{1}{2}$ unit, in the Academy, be waived in the case of Mount Bell on account of a conflict with Physics.

Also that the requirement of Physical Training in the Academy be waived in the case of Mount Bell who was deemed to have sufficient exercise in other ways. Also, in the case of Miss Libbie Berlin who on her physician's statement was unable to take the work.

The Committee on Advanced Standing was continued.

The request of Miss Cordia Lukert that she M.A. Degree be granted the Master of Arts degree for work Declined & done in the graduate department of Bryn Mawr College was declined on motion of Prof. Brown.

Minutes of the last meeting were read
and approved.

Prof. Wilson presented the request of the
Athletic Committee that Mr. Curtis Lippen
who entered college two weeks ago be allowed
to play foot-ball with the second team in
non-conference games. Voted.

Prof. Ritchie gave the report for the com-
mittee on Advanced Standing, as follows:

Catalogue
1916-17.

1. Application for Advanced Standing shall
be made during the first year of college
residence.
2. Application for advanced standing will be
considered only with reference to work done in
excess of the requirement for graduation from
the secondary school of which the applicant is
a graduate.
3. The applicant for advanced standing shall
take an examination on the subject matter
concerned. Provided, however, that the instructor
concerned may grant credit on the basis of
the quality of work done in continuation of
same subject.
4. The examination shall be held on the
first Wednesday in March.

The report was adopted on motion of Profs.
Ritchie and Brown.

Voted on motion of Dean Hardy that rule
Catalogue C, Athletics, Catalogue p. 27, be revised as
1916-17. follows: (1) Athletic Director to read Dean or
Principal; (2) Tuesday noon " " Tuesday 4.30 P.M.

President Price presented a petition from more than 200 College and Academy students that the Thanksgiving vacation of one day, November 30, be extended to include Friday and Saturday, December 1 and 2.

Profs. Wilson and Ritchie moved & grant on condition that school be held on Monday, November 27.

Christmas
Vacation-1916
Changed. Profs. Hardy and Groner moved as a substitute that the Christmas vacation begin at 4.30 P.M. Friday Dec. 15 and close at 8.00 A.M. Tuesday, Jan. 2, instead of Thursday 4.30 P.M. Dec. 21 and Wednesday 8.00 A.M. as published in the catalogue. This motion was accepted, and, following discussion, adopted.
