

DR. CHANDLER LEAVES NEW PLAN FOR ANNUAL

IS OLDEST MAN ON FACULTY IN SERVICE.

Has Been With O. U. Thirteen Years Years, First as Prof. Then as Librarian—Has Faithful Service is Deeply Appreciated by all Old Students.

Dr E. K. Chandler, D. D., who for the past twelve years has been actively connected with the faculty of Ottawa University as instructor and librarian has tendered his resignation to the board of trustees and will leave Ottawa in the near future. For the past few months, Dr Chandler has been in poor health and it is with the purpose in view of seeking more agreeable climate that he will leave.

Dr Chandler is the oldest member in point of service on the faculty, having come to Ottawa to accept the chair in the history, economics and sociology department in 1901. From 1901 to 1909 he was actively engaged in teaching, but in 1910 assumed direction of the library, which he has been instrumental in building up from a few volumes to one of the best among the smaller colleges of the state.

Dr. Chandler has not definitely decided where he will go, but probably will spend part of the summer in Ottawa. He will go south in the winter, but it is undetermined whether it will be to Florida or California.

Dr. Chandler has been one of the most respected and best loved members of the faculty during his stay at Ottawa. The many students and alumni who have come into close touch with him in their work bear unanimous and hearty testimony to the inspiration which he has been to them, and to the value which they have received from his sympathetic friendship.

As librarian Dr Chandler has been largely responsible for the steady growth of this department of the university from a nucleus of zero following the fire in 1901, until it is one of the best balanced libraries in the state. The library passed the 7000 mark this winter, and since that time several hundred more volumes have been added.

His departure will leave a gap in the university faculty which it will be hard to fill.
