Is the New Dean of the College Replacing W. D. Bemmels

Dr. Wayne D. Angell, '52, will become Dean of the College on September 1. He will replace Dr. W. D. Bemmels who resigned to devote full time to teaching and other duties in the Department of Physics which he heads.

Angell, an Ottawa faculty member since 1956, is now head of the Department of Economics and chairman of the Social Science Division. He will yield the department leadership to Prof. Sherwin Snyder, a member of the staff for several years and presently completing Ph.D. degree work in Indiana University.

Angell is also co-chairman with Dr. Ann Greer of the important Faculty-Student Self-Study Committee which

is probing into educational objectives and functions in O. U. and in other universities as a basis for Ottawa curriculum revisions.

Angell is active in Baptist affairs being recently elected vice-president of the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society. An area Republican leader, he served two terms in the Kansas legislature as Franklin County representative.

After graduating from O. U. in 1952 he took graduate work in the University of Kansas and was awarded a Ph.D. degree in economics in 1957.

He and wife Betty Barnett Angell, '53, have four children. Wayne is a native of Plains, Kans., a son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis Angell.

Robert Anderson Is Comptroller

Robert A. Anderson, '61, has been named comptroller of the University. He will assist Business Manager Robert A. Bundy with financial records, budget procedures and the accounting needs of the University.

Among specific duties will be assisting with payrolls, cost studies, collection of student accounts, audits and student organization accounts.

The position is a new one at the University.

Anderson has been associated with the Continental Oil Company since graduation.

Dick Powell Becomes Director of Admissions

Richard Powell, '58, on July 1 became Director of Admissions for the University. He replaces Dale K. Turner, '57, who by his own request is returning to a role as an Admissions Counselor. He held the Director post for two years in the Illinois-Michigan area and in Colorado.

Powell comes to the Directorship from the admissions staff of Colorado State University in Fort Collins. In the 1966-67 year he was Admissions Coun-

selor for O. U. in Colorado. Previously he was a high school teacher and coach in Colorado Springs. His first job after graduation was with the Y.M.C.A. there. He holds a master's degree from Colorado College.

He will head a staff of counselors made up of Turner, Ben Moor, '58 (who will spend a couple of fall months assisting in football coaching), Paul Ditlevson, '68, and David Neeley of Scott City. Powell and this excellent group of men are already deep into

their planning for building a good entering class for the fall of 1969.
