

The CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
of the Ottawa University Women's Club

Since March, 1968, the date of the most recent printing,
the amendments or changes recorded below have been adopted:

AMENDMENT to the By-Laws

Changing Sections 1, 2, inserting a new Section 3, and
including Section 4, a revision of the previous #3.

Article V. SCHOLARSHIPS

Section 1. The Treasurer shall receive funds from the
club treasury, individual gifts and projects to finance the
scholarship fund.

Section 2. Scholarships awarded each April 1st shall
be upon recommendation of the Scholarship Committee.

Section 3. Scholarships presented by the club shall be
known as the "Marjorie Martin Scholarships."

Section 4. Scholarships shall be awarded to one or
more deserving women who contribute to the life and spirit of
the University community and have a grade point average of 3.0
or better. A woman may receive a scholarship as often as the
committee chooses.

AMENDMENT to the By-Laws

Article VI. DISSOLUTION

At such time as this organization shall be dissolved, all
assets shall be transferred to Ottawa University, a tax-exempt
organization, to be used in the O. U. Scholarship Fund as a

Article VI, VII, and VII become VII, VII, and IX,
but are otherwise unchanged.
