Letters of appreciation and congratulations were read from President Lyndon B. Johnson, Governor John Connally, Senators Ralph Yarborough and John Tower, Congressman Bob Poage, Dr. Paul Geren of the State Department, Chancellor W. R. White of Baylor, and several distinguished former students. A taped address by Dr. Porter Routh, Executive Secretary of

the Southern Baptist Convention and Professor Capp's college debate colleague, was played.

Several former students made brief speeches of appreciation including Dr. Abner McCall, President of Baylor University; George Schell, debate director at Los Angeles Loyola University; Mike Henke and David Hendrick recent graduates, and Don Howell, attorney. Mr. C. J. Humphrey, attorney of Amarillo, Texas and former Special Distinction member of Pi Kappa Delta was master of ceremonies and the principal address was made by Mr. Joe Allbritton, President of Allbritton Enterprises and distinguished alumni of Pi Kappa Delta.

A bound volume of letters, a silver service, and several checks for the debate program were presented to Professor and Mrs. Capp. The ex-debaters association voted at a previous meeting to start a campaign to raise \$100,000 to endow Baylor's Forensic Program. The campaign is about one-third completed.

BOWLING GREEN STATE UNIVERSITY

Under the capable direction of Prof. Gene Eakins, the teams have attended eight tournaments by December 4.
