## The Center of His Experience is Christ

- Russian peasants in worship. Secret police came to find <sup>out</sup> who they were.

- "Foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man hath nowhere to lay his head."

③ He Knew Thirst

- On the Cross "2 Thirst"

④ He Knew Estrangement

- He was cut off from the father

"My God, My God Why hast thou

- "This day visit thou with me in  
Paradise."

⑤ Finally He Knew Death

- He offers us Everlasting Life
