In addition to this, cases have been procured to Contain the apparatus which was purchased last year. The expense of this improvement was Thirty Seven dollars and ten cents (\$37.10) Three lots in this city have been dold to the Christian church for one hun-dred and fifty dollars; one third cash; one third payable in one year, and one third powable in one year, and one third in Two years, with interest at ten percent. At the meeting of the Board of Directoro, in January last an offer was received from &dalet Matthems, formerly, odalet Jones, to sell her interest in the estate of the late Ker. J. J. Jones, for Two Hundred and fifty dollars. The proposition was accepted and the money required for that purpose was borrowed. The engagement with Prof. Williams + with Miss Short, haring expired the Murarsity is left mithout teachers. In view of this fact the Board of Sirector have desired the following recommendalions to be made, 1. That immediate efforts be made to Decure evitable teachers. 2. That more attention be given to a course of studies for young ladies, such as music frainting, French oc, so that all who wish may find a complete course here. 3. In view of this fact the Board of Director have desired the following recommended action to be made.

- 1. That immediate efforts be made to secure suitable teachers.
- 2. That more attention be given to a course of studies for young ladies, such as music, painting, French &, so that all who wish may find a compete course here.
- 3. That an effort ne made through the state to raise the balance of Prof. Williams salary.
