To the Board of Trustees of Ottawa
University.

Gentlemen:

The following
is a brief summary of Classes
taught and work done. I
have taught - during the year
nine different Classes, two
in Greek, two in English Gram-
mar, one each in Arithmetic,
Geography, Physiology, English
Literature and the Bible.

I have given instruction during
three terms to the Class in
Arithmetic and to the advanced
Class in Greek; two terms
to the classes in English
Literature and the beginners

in Greek; and one term to the
classes in Geography Physiology
and the two classes in Grammar.

The Classes in Arithmetic
Geography, Physiology, English
Literature and the Advanced
Class in Grammar Com-
pleted their text books.
The Senior Preparatory Greek
Class, ^{Law} read three books of Xenophon's
Anabasis and four books of
Herodotus and Law completed
Jones' Poore Composition, the
Junior Class in Greek Law
Completed 110 pages of White's
Lessons and are now ready
to begin reading the
Anabasis.

In giving instruction in
Grammar I have endeavored
to make the subject practical
and to reduce to immediate

and constant practice, the
vital principles of the science.

In Greek, a considerable part
of the work has been foundation
work, and this work we have en-
deavored to do well. I wish
no shis connection to call your
attention to two things, which
during the past year have been
very noticeable; first, the great-
value of a language as a means
of winning to studiousness and
calling into vigorous exercise
the faculties of the mind; and second,
the great-value to the student
of pursuing a prescribed course
of study. Those who have entered
upon a regular course of study,
have exhibited an ardor and
a determination in their work
and a degree of scholarly
attainment not often seen

ni those who study without
any fixed plan.

The Class in Bible study
have met each Sunday after-
noon since October. The attend-
ance has been voluntary. ³³
have enrolled themselves as
members. The average attend-
ance has been 16. Six Epistles
have been studied. I have
sought to secure for the Bible
lessons, the same amount
of study and the same de-
gree of preparation, on the part
of students, as for any other
study of the course. ~~The effort~~
