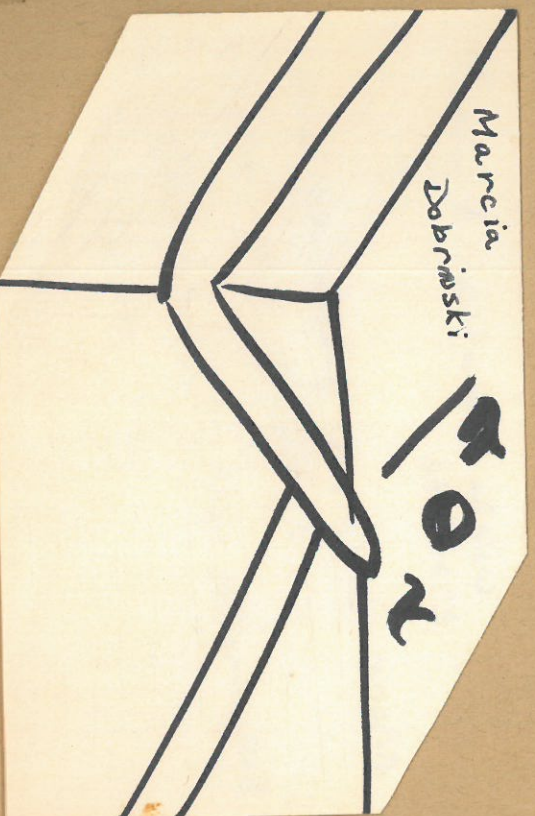

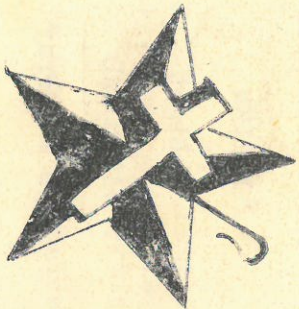

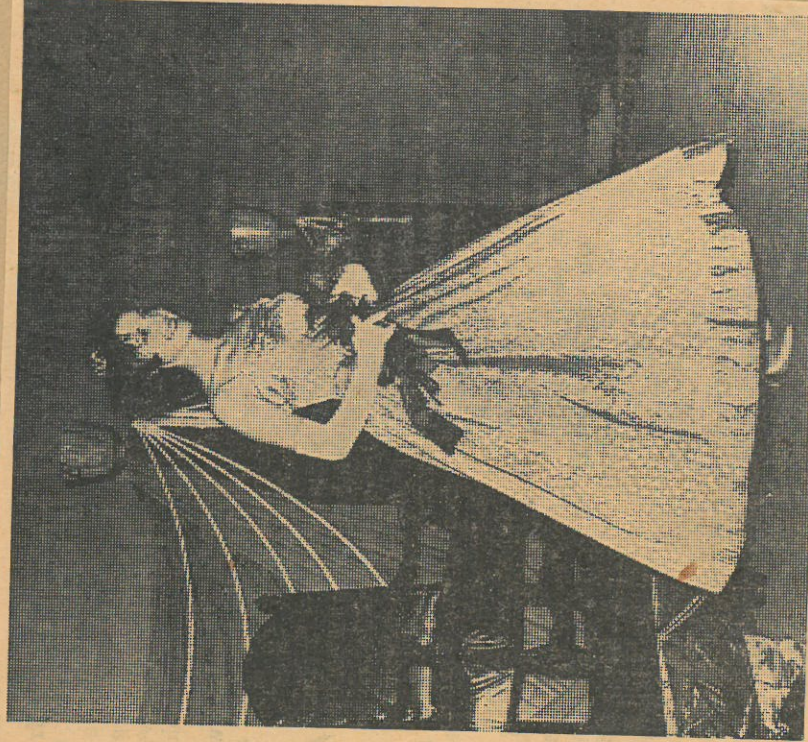
Dr. Wayne Angell was the Master of Ceremonies of the Pageant which began at 8:00 p.m.

The first event in the actual competition was the evening gown presentation, where each contestant was introduced wearing a formal evening gown.

The next event was the talent contest. This is the most important single event in the competition and may count as much as one-half of a contestant's total points. Miss Freshour presented Chopin's "Etude" at the piano, and she sang "The Sound of Music." Among the other acts were a Hula, done by Elizabeth Hinton; and a song, "Go Away from my Window" by Janet Grogan, who accompanied herself on the autoharp. Sandra Holmes sang "Misty" and Marney Dyess sang a Scottish air "Loch Lomond."

After the talent contest, the swim suit presentation was held, with each girl appearing in a bathing suit. This event is probably the best known of any in beauty contest competition.

After a short intermission Mr. Russell Price, past president of Lions International, was introduced. He presented each contestant with a small gift from the Ottawa Lions Club as a token of their appreciation. He also announced and

The final judging was based on these questions, and after a short organ interlude, the winners were announced. The second runner-up was Susan Lee Harvey; and the first runner-up was Dixie Wollam.
