The Women's Educational Society of Ottawa is a valuable adjunct to Ottawa University. It works in harmony with the faculty and trustees of the university for the betterment of the girls of O. U. Its special feature is the material aid afforded to girls who must make their own way through school. It finds home for worthy students, and loans the money necessary for books and tuition in such a way that no girl need hesitate to accept the offer of the Women's Educational Society.

Since its organization the W. E. S. has been able to aid fourteen girls, and their expressions of appreciation and gratitude testify to the worthiness of the society. It was organized in 1902 with Mrs. J. D. S. Riggs as its president, who

continued in that capacity until her removal from Ottawa. Its membership is composed mainly of the leading women of Ottawa and vicinity, without regard to church or creed, though it has some members in other parts of Kansas. It has an executive board of eighteen members, who will be glad to answer any questions in regard to the working methods of the society.

The president for 1907-8 is Mrs. S. E. Price, the wife of President Price. Mrs. J. S. Beatty is chairman of committee for finding homes for girls, and Miss Margaret Stickler is chairman of the committee for Material Aid.
