





Billinger's Beliefs Kept Him at WSU

Jim Billinger played football for just one year at North Kansas City. Mo., high school. He was an instant success and was named to the allconference second team

The Wichita State coaching staff made Billinger into a high school hero when they gave him a football scholarship. Obviously a young man bound for big things.

But college stardom did not come for Billinger. He was injured his freshman year and missed the season. His sophomore year, when things looked brighter, he suffered another injury.

Then a new coaching staff entered the picture and things could have been very bleak for Billinger. After all, a player who has suffered two injuries in two years does not have an impressive record.

But Jim Billinger is a Christian. He didn't take the easy way out and give

up. His Christian experience and life made him into a staver. Shocker head coach Jim Wright was one of the first to find this out

"A player who has faced an assortment of injuries can lose confidence in himself." Wright said. "Jim and I had tv." many talks about this and through his hard work and repetition and improvedconfidence in himself, he has become amuch better ball player."

Billinger was voted the 'Most Improved Player' at the conclusion of last spring's practice. The 175-pound junior started his first varsity game last Saturday at split end.

"Jim is the type of player who will make the big play," said Wright. And Wright's praise did not end with his playing ability.

"Jim is a fine young man, a very good, stable Christian athlete," he said. "His Christian attitude is very evident on and off the field."

Billinger plays down his own talents while giving all the credit for his cur-

rent status to God. "My faith in God. helped me stay here." he said. "There but I believe God sent me here for a purpose. I give him all the credit for my increased confidence in my abili-

It was after he was injured Billinger really turned to his Christian beliefs for strength. "That was when I really needed help so I turned to God and He got me straightened out. Now I don't try to come on too strong about my Christian belief, but I try to be a leader in my own way. I want my teammates to respect me for what I am. not what I try to be."

Billinger, who is the first in his family to attend college, displays the affection he has for his teammates when he speaks about them.

"Sam Adkins and all the quarterbacks are really willing to help me out,"he said. "Anytime I want them to stay after practice to throw to me they do it.

"The offensive line is doing a great job this year. They are giving Sam were times when I wanted to give up, more time to throw and this gives us (receivers) more time to run our pat-




I Corinthians 11:23-34


For the tradition which I handed on to you came to me from the Lord himself; that the Lord Jesus, on the night of his arrest, took bread and, after giving thanks to God, broke it and said: 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way, he took the cup after supper, and said: 'This cup is the new covenant sealed by my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' For every time you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord, until he comes.

It follows that anyone who eats the bread and drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will be guilty of desecrating the body and blood of the Lord. A man must test himself before eating his share of the bread and drinking from the cup. For he who eats and drinks eats and drinks judgement on himself if he does not discern the Body. That is why many of you are feeble and sick, and a number have died. But if we examined ourselves, we should not thus fall under judgement. When, however, we do fall under the Lord's judgement, he is disciplining us, to save us from being condemned with the rest of the world.

Therefore, my brothers, when you meet for a meal, wait for one another. If you are hungry, eat at home, so that in meeting together you may not fall under judgement. The other matters I will arrange when I come.
