MEN'S BASKETBALL

Bill Frear, head coach of the men's basketball squad, will see a lot of familiar faces when the 1977-78 season gets under way this fall with eight lettermen returning from a 9-14 season last year.

Frear will welcome back seniors Kevin Moore, Jim Perkins and Bobby Washington who hold honors of Heart of America All-Conference first, second and honorable mention, respectively from the previous season. Wade Banks, another HAAC All-Conference honorable mention selection, will return to begin his sophomore campaign. These selections just happen to own the top four spots on the Braves' 1976-77 scoring leaders' list with Kevin Moore leading the way with 17.9 points a game.

The 1976-77 version of the OU squad started slowly, dropping nine of its first 10 outings before storming to an 8-5 record through the remainder of the season. The Braves grabbed the third spot in the HAAC with a 7-5 record losing two games by a point and another by five in overtime.

During the first half of the season the Braves did not put things together on either end of the court. Offensively, OU could average only 62.5 points through their first 10 contests while giving up 85.0 points a game. Over the second half of the season (13 games) OU averaged 69.9 points a game while the opposition could muster only 68.7 points a game, a far cry from the 85 points a game originally given up.

Fouls also played a major part in the squad with Kevin Moore, in a category he would rather not lead, pacing the squad in fouls averaging 3.4 a game while the team was whistled for an average of 20.5 fouls a game. The year of experience that the squad has under their belts has coach Frear, in his 22nd year at the helm, optimistic for one of OU's best seasons ever.

The Braves sport a 20 game schedule, not including a two tournament stint which will take them to Salina for the season opening Kansas Wesleyan Classic and Wichita for the Friends University Tournament. The season will come to a close on Feb. 18 with Baker arriving in Ottawa for a HAAC game.

The key for the Braves is to come out strong in their early contests, an area that has been a problem over the years. If they can accomplish that, they may well find themselves champions this season.



When people talk in terms of rebuilding, it would be somewhat easy to assume that the women's basketball team will hope to do exactly that in the 1977-78 season under the reins of first year coach Bill Boucek. The women put together a 3-17 record with two victories over Baker and a solo shot over Missouri Valley. Of the 17 losses, four were less than ten point defeats and of those four losses two games were decided by less than five points.

Eight letterwomen will return including two year letterwoman and HAAC All-Conference second team selection Susan Mitchum, a junior. Also returning will be Jenelle Robins, a junior with one letter and Jody Sigwardt with the same credentials. Boucek would like to see the three women provide the leadership to an already young squad. The remaining five letterwomen will return as sophomores, but as the letter indicates, a year's experience under their belts. Boucek would like to see a little more offense out of his squad as last year they could only muster 40.5 points a game. The opposition on the other hand averaged 54.4 points a game. The women got some help from the schedule makers when they shortened the schedule from 20 games to 17 games, which might cut down the effects of traveling. Of the 17 games eight will be played in Ottawa. The Braves open the 1977-78 campaign against Friends University, a squad that was not on the OU schedule last year. With eight letterwomen returning the women's basketball squad should play with more confidence and poise, and provide some exciting action for OU fans.

They are anxious to make the cheerleader's role a more active one at O.U. and judging from their performance in Colorado, there is no doubt that the spirit is rising...




TENNIS

Following a year of good individual performances, the women's track team is looking for much of the same in the 1978 season.

Head coach Bill Boucek will welcome back 220 and 440 yard sprinter Barbara Walker, as well as Annette Buldrige, another sprinter in the 100 and 220 yard dash areas. Boucek lost Marilyn Lee, a shot put competitor, to a school transfer.

As team scores went, it was not a tremendously

successful 1977 campaign, because in most of the meets only individual results are kept. In the one dual meet the women hosted, they defeated the Washburn Ichabods. Other meets the women participated in were the Tabor Relays and McPherson Relays in which they placed fairly successfully. There is no HAAC meet for women.

Boucek hopes to see improvement this year when the women take to the track.

MEN'S TRACK

Over the years the Ottawa University track team has compiled 17 champions of the HAAC meet but slipped to a fourth place finish in 1977.

The 1978 track squad, under the direction of Bill Boucek, should provide some exciting action for Braves' fans. Boucek will welcome back numerous lettermen including Jim Perkins, a 440 man who long jumps, triple jumps and runs a leg on the mile relay. Others returning include William Hales, a triple jumper, Keith Butler, a discus thrower, Brian Merkle, a sprinter, Mike McRoberts, an intermediate hurdler, and Paul Van Arsdale in the 440. Specialty men coming back will be Bruce Underwood, distance runner, Steve McInnis, a shot putter, Dennis Green, a triple jumper and Joel Pavelonis, a pole vaulter.

In most major relay meets the team scores are no longer kept, and only individual awards are given to the athletes. In meets where score was kept, OU won one dual and one triangular meet. The Braves also dropped a dual to William Jewell for their only head to head loss of the season.
