Students Are to Assemble at Depot to Welcome Return.

A VICTORY FOR OTTAWA

PROF. C. V. STANSELL ACCOMPANIED THE REPRESENTATIVE AS DELEGATE AND WIRED NEWS.

Great Demonstration of Ottawa Spirit Shown When Appeal Was Made for Funds to Send a Delegation—Husted May Get to Go to New York Contest With the Winner.

Des Moines, Ia., May 2.—Harold Husted, of Ottawa University, representing the state of Kansas in the Inter-state Peace Oratorical contest here last night won second place. Husted's oration, "The Task of the Twentieth Century," was one of the best among the six contestants and he ran a close race with the winner.

Husted will arrive at Ottawa tonight at 6.50 o'clock and the students are all asked to report at the depot with pennants, megaphones and other suitable paraphernalia to celebrate the victory.

Harold Husted, representative of the colleges of Kansas in the Peace Oratorical left Thursday afternoon accompanied by Prof. Stansell for Des Moines, Iowa, where he was to deliver his oration, "The Task of the Twentieth Century," in the central group of interstate contests last night.

Mr. Husted gave his oration in chapel Thursday morning, and received a fine ovation from the student body and visitors, who were present. His style of delivery shows great improvement in modulation, gesture and ease on the platform. Barring accidents of any kind, Mr. Husted should be a strong contender for premier honors in the contest with representatives from Missouri, Nebraska, South Dakota and Iowa.

Prof. Stansell was elected by the student body to go with Husted as a delegate, and after the famous Ottawa Spirit had been awakened from its peaceful slumber by some rousing yells led by Glen Van Meter, Walter Martin made an appeal for the where withal to send the delegate, as also to take care of the expense incurred with the celebration of winning the state contest at Topeka two weeks ago. True to spirit of the institution the response was splendid revealing the loyalty of the student body to all of its student activities.

Five inter-state meets were to be held last night, the winner from each to go to Lake Mohonk, New York, where the National contest is to be held in the next few days.
