Ottawa University
International Program

Ottawa University offers instruction leading to the bachelor's degree at three international locations -- Hong Kong, Taiwan and Malaysia. All instruction is in English. There are four periods of instruction lasting two weeks each at the international site and then an additional required period of instruction on the home campus in Ottawa, Kansas. At each of these five meetings a student typically enrolls in two courses. A portion of the course work takes place during these meetings and other assignments are completed by students and evaluated by faculty in the times between meetings. To earn the B.A. degree a student must successfully complete course work earning thirty-one semester hours in either Business Administration or Education. Both programs also include general education courses reflecting the unique character of Ottawa University education.

To qualify for admission, a student must present ninety-four semester hours of acceptable college level credit transferrable to Ottawa University. The applicant must be proficient in use of the English language as demonstrated by a score of 500 or higher on the TOEFL test or as determined by an Ottawa University faculty member during an individual interview. The application process includes a statement by potential students of their educational and career goals.

Ottawa University is represented by the Institute for American Higher Education (IAHE) for purposes of recruiting students, receiving applications, collecting tuition and fees, arranging for classrooms and hospitality for faculty. IAHE maintains offices in each of the locations where Ottawa University carries on instruction in the international program. All courses are taught by Ottawa University faculty who travel to these locations for instructional purposes.

The Ottawa University international program commenced in 1986 and these international sites are specifically included in the statement of affiliation status in the University's accreditation by North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
