## The Gospel According to Mark

### ① The Recording of Events that Had Happened.

- Mark sets out to record - not invent.
- Writing to keep the record straight and to strengthen during Nero's persecution.
- Crucial that these are facts.

C.H. Dodd: "Some religions can be indifferent to historical fact and move entirely upon the plane of timeless truth, Christianity cannot. It rests upon the affirmation that a series of events happened, in which God revealed Himself in action, for the salvation of men."

- In the events Mark records is the Gospel, the Good News, Man's salvation!

### ② This Good News Has Said Bold on Mark - His Gospel

- During the life of Jesus
  - Last Supper in his home.
  - Sleeping in the garden.
- Traveled with the Great Paul & Barnabas.
- Was with Peter when he met the end.
- This became his first-hand Gospel.

③ His Gospel Has The Unique Stamp of Mark on It.

- Written in the Vulgar Greek of the Streets.

(1) It is a Story of Action That Moves.

- Jesus is always doing things. His teaching is brief and terse. Reflects Peter.

- Key word is straightway or immediately.

(2) Mark puts people at the center of his Story.

- James' daughter

- Peter's Mother-in-law

(3) Jesus is the Strong Son of God

- Death of Peter under Nero in the 60's.

## Stevenson's Speech

Stevenson first cites his own recent observations of the Soviet Union: "An overwhelming impression of thrust and purpose in most aspects of Soviet life . . . no effort, no dedication, no sacrifice is too great that may help realize the Communist party's goals in Soviet society . . . no corner of humanity can be a matter of indifference to the Communists, because the whole human

brotherhood possible through  
Communist Revolution."

"If freedom means ease alone, if it means shirking the hard disciplines of learning, if it means evading the rigors and rewards of creative activity, if it means more expenditure on adjusting than education, if it means 'bachelor cooking' and 'life adjustment' courses in the schools, and the steady cult of the trivial and the mediocre, if it means—worst of all—indifference or contempt for all but athletic excellence, we may keep for a time the forms of free society, but its spirit will be dead.

"I believe we have had enough of adjustment, conformity, easy options and the least common denominator in our system.

"We do not slip into happiness. It is strenuously sought and earned. A nation glued to the television screen is not simply at a loss before the iron pioneers of the new collective society. It isn't even having a good time. No society has ever spent as much as we do on drink and tranquilizers. Can we argue that this is evidence of universal fun? . . .

While we were yet helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.

But God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we are now justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. Not only so, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received our reconciliation. (Romans 5: 6 - 8-11)

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; it does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. And every one who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure.

We know that we have passed out of death into

life, because we love the brethren. He who does not love remains in death. Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. But if any one has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or speech but in deed and in truth. (I John 3: 1-3 14-18)

## 1935 - 1960

A quick look at the highlights of our history as recorded in the 25 volumes of the Times. One is profoundly impressed with the activities of the Women's Mission Society, Church School, Young People's Groups, Choirs, Scouts, Men's Fellowship, Active Boards, continual emphasis on evangelism and personal commitment, and our loyal participation in all national projects. The pastor has asked me to include the names of some whose activities have been noteworthy. The list should be ten times as long to include those whose work in the Church has been equally significant. And what wonderful Staff Members we have had.

1935. CITY TEMPLE TIMES started March 8 by Pastor U. S. Mitchell, who introduced many other innovations. 25th anniversary of dedication of CITY TEMPLE observed in Fall with many of original choir. Those known to be living after 50 years (in 1960) are Mrs. F. H. Weatherwax, Mrs. A. E. Godfrey, Bessie Haas, Harold Odell, and Mr. and Mrs. Cressey all of Sioux Falls, and the following elsewhere: Mr. and Mrs. O. H.
