FIRST GAME ON SEPT. 28

NINE GAMES TO BE PLAYED
FIVE ON HOME FIELD

Good Material in Line And Backfield-
Many High School Athletes Out-
Capt. Hewitt And Eight
Letter Men Back

With the call of Coach Cowell for football men to assemble for practice, there came a large squad of about forty husky athletes to the field. Every night now is witnessing a good strenuous workout on the temporary gridiron south of the science hall.

Prospects are good this year for a successful, winning team. Nine letter men have reported for practice, and there is a host of new material to pick from. The letter men back this year are: Hewitt, captain and end; Olds, half; Shoger, fullback; F. Behan, end; Smith, tackle; Gillett, guard; Gere, enter; Thomas, tackle; Savage, guard; and it is thought that Arlan Baker, a guard, will be back, although he has not enrolled as yet.

Of the new material, H. Brannaman, Ottawa High School star, is showing up in first class fashion at the pilot position; Higley who comes from Effingham, is doing good work at full; Hickman, hailing from Stafford, looks good at half; Longtonk, a colored lad from Pratt, is displaying some classy halfback work; Thomas, an Ottawa High man of last year, is working an end well; and McHenry, from a Missouri high school, looks pretty good at the pivot position. There is a host of other line and backfield material that may show some real worth before the whistle blows for the initial kick-off.

In all probability the line-up will be somewhat lighter than the teams have been in the last two years, but what ~~ever may be lacking in lightness~~ is more than balanced by the speed and fight that is being demonstrated.

The games this year are going to require a great deal of hard and intensive training. The first game is booked for Sept. 28 with Bethany, and is to be played on the home field. Following this game there is to be one more game on the home field before the team invades enemy territory at St. Mary's.

Of course to make any predictions this early in the season is purely a matter of conjecture. But with the coaching ability that Everett Cowell has displayed, and with the enthusiasm and fire that the men are responding to him, prospects look the best in years for a successful, winning team in Ottawa University.
