- ^{Deeper life of our faith} The conclusion of this service - our best commitment.

Paul's Personal Intimate Love Letter - Philippians

① Comes from prison - Don't be ashamed.

The Gospel is being spread even here.

② Thanks the Philippians for the money sent.

③ Strikes A Deep Personal Note.

- "For the To Live Is Christ To Die Gain"

- "Have This Mind the You Which Was Also in Christ Jesus"

④ Then There Is A Striking Arresting Phrase

- "That I May Know Him in the Power of His Resurrection and the Fellowship of His Sufferings"

- This sounds like a young eager man
but this is an old scarred veteran who is still ready for battle.

⑤ "The Fellowship of His Sufferings"

- Fellowship - like having all things in common.

- Sitting down at a longue table

- Here are you, you, you.

- And over there is the cup of his suffering.
- Anyone who is to know him in depth and intimacy must drink that cup.
- The words of Christ.
 - "Except a grain of wheat fall into the ground and die"
 - "If any man would come after me let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow me"
 - Are you able to drink my cup?

Christ's Suffering In The Presence of Sin

① Three Occasions When He Suffered.

- Looking Over Jerusalem.
 - Wicked and debauched with its unholiness. He cried out in anguish.
- The Woman Who Was Caught in The Lie
 - He stooped and wrote in the ground.
- Face to face with Herod
 - Mocked and cheap with his shame.
 - He never spoke a word.

② How Different Our Attitude Is

- We would rather drift and take the easy way.
- We laugh at sin, make jokes about it all and are entertained by it.
- We do not root it out of our own lives.
- We live with it in our communities.

Syn - coming to know the shame of his people.

"I fell upon my knees and spread out my hands unto the Lord my God; and I said, O my God, I am ashamed and blush to lift up my face to Thee."

Christ Suffered With The Suffering of Others

① Those Occasions When He Suffered.

- The shame of the woman who came to Simon's House.
- The burden of the Demoniac.
- Sorrow at the home of Lazarus.
 - "And Jesus wept."

② We Say "We Get Enough of My Own."

- Then we My Own ticks and pains.
- Yet the burden of another brings new life.
- We were born with the capacity for suffering
 - Look at a child.
 - And we prostitute that capacity.

③ Those Experiences of Suffering

- The woman sitting with another woman

"I just held her hand and said nothing and we both wept."

- Charles Farnham going to Mary in the midst of mental illness.
