












Spectator Conduct At Athletic Events

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, of which Ottawa University is a member, has recommended the adoption of a statement of guidelines for the conduct of spectators at athletic events. The following guidelines have been approved by the Faculty Athletic Committee of Ottawa University.

1. The players and coaches of the opposing team, as well as the officials, are guests of Ottawa University. They should be treated courteously.

2. Spectators are not allowed on the playing area.
 3. No objects are to be thrown onto the playing area.
 4. The drinking of beverages containing alcohol is prohibited on the Ottawa University campus.
 5. Please refrain from discourteous or abusive language or actions directed to the officials or to team members.

Soccer History & Records

OU SOCCER HISTORY

Soccer came to Ottawa University in 1963 through the efforts of President Andrew B. Martin, a native of Ireland. Within two years the program grew from club status to a varsity sport. The 1965 team was inexperienced but enthusiastic. Players, as has been the tradition since then, come from all over the country and other parts of the world. This diverse group was led by OU's first soccer coach, Bob Schoonover.

1967 proved to be the first winning season for the Braves as the team went 7-6-1. Schoonover did much of his recruiting on the East Coast. This brought many diverse and experienced players to OU. All of this talent was ably molded and with the help of Schoonover's assistant coach, Tony Van Leiden, the OU soccer team won its first MO-KAN Conference title and area championship which earned them a berth in the 1969 NAIA Soccer Tourney.

1969 was followed by a realignment of the soccer conferences, from the MO-KAN to the Mid-West Conference and two more consecutive trips to the NAIA National Soccer Tourney. With the winning tradition came a demanding twenty-game schedule against nationally ranked opponents such as UMSL, Eastern Illinois, Southern Illinois, and Air Force Academy, to name a few. Through 1971 the OU soccer team had compiled a record of 74-29-3.

In 1978 Paul McNally took over as the head coach and led the Braves to their third consecutive winning season and their first contention for the District 10 NAIA title since 1971.

Frank Lemp, a former OU soccer Brave, took charge in the summer of 1980. His four year stay kept OU teams in the thick of things. Defeating Benedictine twice, with a memorable overtime game in the 1981 District 10 Championship, several overtime games and a tie with Rockhurst as well as a tie in several nail-biting games with Avila, put the Braves on parity with the best teams in the Area II of the NAIA.

In 1984, Jeff Wolfe replaced Lemp to coach the Braves, who had an all time soccer record of 155-105-13. Wolfe's first year saw a great deal of inexperience on the roster and the Braves went 7-11-1. This included another Ottawa appearance in the District 10 Championship, with the Braves being defeated by Benedictine 3-2.

OU soccer has received national ranking four times, most recently in 1982.




Rosalie (Corkie) Hedlund returns for her fifth year as the Head Volleyball Coach at Ottawa University.
