An evangelizing spirit from first to last has pervaded the school influenced by which a number became Christians. And though it is true that here as elsewhere a young man caught bad company of the elders, yet the prevailing tendencies and influences have been in the right direction. It was found necessary in several ^{instances} ~~instances~~ to resort to the severest penalties of such a ^{school} ~~case~~ as this, that of expulsion, yet the good effects of firm measures were ^{seen}. The fact that during the whole of the term just closing there has ^{never} ~~not~~ been the necessity nor the occasion for a single case of discipline.

For the enlargement of the Library we are looking in ~~three~~ directions. 1. To the University Lecture Course. The Faculty have decided to maintain year by year, a Course of lectures. the proceeds of which shall be applied to the purchase of books for the College Library. 2.
