

DR. PRICE IS TEACHING

Former President Of Ottawa University At University Of Redlands

Dr Silas Eber Price, retired president of Ottawa University, Ottawa, Kansas, is a new member of the faculty of the University of Redlands, Redlands, California. In his new capacity he will teach Bible and Missions, as professor of Biblical Missionary, and Ethical instruction.

Dr Price is a graduate of Denison University, Granville, Ohio, later taking graduate work at the Morgan Park Theological seminary at Chicago and earning his D. D. Degree from Denison in 1907.

Ordained a Baptist minister in 1887, Dr. Prices served as pastor of the Baptist Tabernacle at La Crosse, Wis., the Baptist Tabernacle at Milwaukee, Wis., and the First Baptist church of Ottawa, before becoming president of the University of Ottawa in 1906. As its president, he served the University until 1928, when he retired and came to California.

The courses which Dr Price will teach this fall at the University of Redlands as designed to present the Bible as an essential power in fixing ideals, guiding conduct, and rebuilding character. Intensive courses in the life and teaching of Jesus, the beginnings and expansion the Old and New Testaments, the Bible as a Book and as Literature are included in the department of Christianity, and introduction to which Dr. Price will have charge.

A knowledge of missions and of missionary problems is contained in two courses also offered by Dr. Price, one teaching the history of Missions, and one on the World Outlook, which presents the status of

missionary enterprises throughout the world

Dr. Price is taking the place of Dr Seldon W. Cummings, who was forced to resign temporarily due to illness.

Prof. Egbert R. Nichols and Miss Caroline Mattingly, both former teachers at O. U. are now teaching in the University of Redlands. Prof. Nichols has been head of the department of English for a long term of years, and Miss Mattingly is a teacher in that department.
