The National Council spent three very busy days in Fayetteville finalizing plans for what is sure to be the best Pi Kappa Delta Convention/Tournament ever. It's not too early to begin your plans for joining us March 20-23, 1985 in Fayetteville. Tony Allison will be sending a preview of the Convention/Tournament information and schedule in your Fall Report packet. Robert Littlefield will then be sending finalized schedules, information, tournament rules and the official entry form this November. Please read the information carefully as there are many changes that have been made for this Convention/Tournament. If you have any questions feel free to address Robert or any Council member.

We want to encourage each province to bring a Province Banner for display during the Convention.

PRESIDENT'S NOTE

While we are at it, we would like each chapter/province to be thinking about selecting appropriate attire for our Ozark Country Hoedown on Saturday evening.

There are several items that need to be called to your attention as a result of our summer meeting:

- 1) The National Council will be recommending, for your approval, the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse as the site of the 1987 National Convention/Tournament.
- 2) Harold Widvey from South Dakota State University will be recommended for election to the office of Secretary/Treasurer. His name will appear on the ballot in Fayetteville for your approval.
- 3) At the conclusion of the 1985 Convention, Larry Norton's term as Historian will expire. The Council is currently searching for a new Historian that will continue with the same dedication as Dr. Norton. Anyone interested in being considered for the position of Historian should contact Gary Horn, Chairman of the Search Committee.

Dr. Norton is currently working on a book that encompasses our 75 year history. He asks that anyone having information that would be useful to please contact him.

- 4) Considering the increased costs of Pi Kappa Delta and the continued effort to keep Convention/Tournament fees to a min-

imum, the National Council will be recommending an increase in individual membership fees to \$20.00 and an increase in annual Chapter dues to \$30.00. The organization has not had an increase in fee structure since 1977. The Council would hope that you will support this proposal.

- 5) A Constitutional Amendment was presented by Gary Horn, Chairman of the Constitutional Revision Committee, which calls for a revision in the election of the President and Vice President of Pi Kappa Delta. In essence, the Amendment would allow us to elect a Vice Presi-

dent who then would succeed to the Presidency (Vice-President/President Elect). There will be further explanation of each of these last two items in the Winter issue of the FORENSIC. My purpose now is simply to share information with you of those important items discussed during the summer meeting.

The Council joins we in welcoming you back to a new school year. Our best to you for an educational and successful year. Let us focus on Fayetteville in March. RE-MEMBER—FAYETTEVILLE IS A NATURAL!!

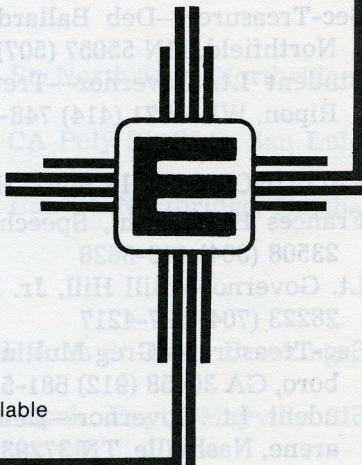

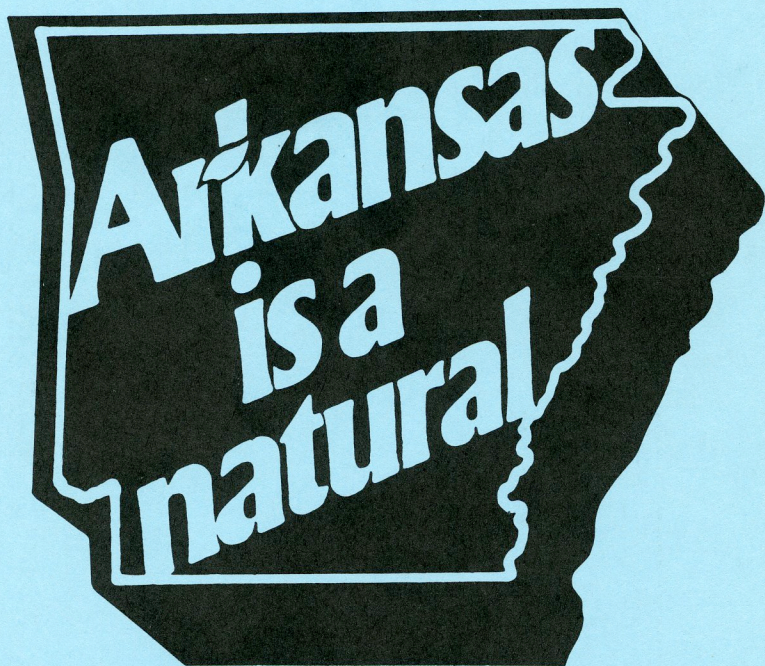
