Pi Kap Alum Receives Appointment

Word of the appointment of Virgil Martin to a National Advisory Committee under Sargeant Shriver by President Johnson makes it relevant to point out that Mr. Martin is a former Pi Kappa Deltan of the Illinois Alpha Chapter. Having joined the organization in 1929, the record of his activities indicate that he has utilized speech skills and indeed exemplified our motto.

He was born in Kankakee, Illinois, on July 8, 1907. Mr. Martin graduated from Illinois Wesleyan in 1932, after which he served at his alma mater as University Men's counselor, alumni secretary, and instructor in speech. He then served as a field representative for the American City Bureau until 1938 when he joined the Indianapolis Community Fund and Council of Social Agencies as Assistant Director, and in 1939 was named the Executive Director. In 1942 he served as Special Services Director for the National War Fund, and then later as the Executive Director for the

National War Fund's New York City Metropolitan Organization. In 1946 he became the General Superintendent of the Wm. H. Block Company, Indianapolis, and joined Carson Pirie Scott and Company as its General Superintendent in 1949. He is now President of Carson's.

Mr. Martin is a Director of the First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Chicago, and is a Trustee of Illinois Wesleyan, the National Health and Welfare Association, the United Community Funds and Councils of America, Chairman of the State Street Council, Trustee of the Chicago Sunday Evening Club, and has served as the President and Director of the Chicago Retail Merchants Association, as well as the Illinois Retail Merchants Association.

In 1962 Illinois Wesleyan conferred an honorary doctor of laws degree on him. He was the featured speaker at the graduation ceremonies this June for the 1965 graduating class.

The Editor Signs Off...

It is gratifying to note in this issue of **The Forensic** the amount of interest generated by the 24th National Convention. Perhaps the effectiveness of a convention can best be judged by the work that goes on in the period between conventions in response to the deliberations of the organization. If this is true, the convention at Tacoma may prove to be one of the most successful!

You will find this issue filled with references to the business of the convention. I would direct your attention to Harvey Cromwell's **Resume of National Officers of Pi Kappa Delta**, Gilbert Rau's article on Discussion and Kenneth B. Font's latest plea for Oral Interp.
