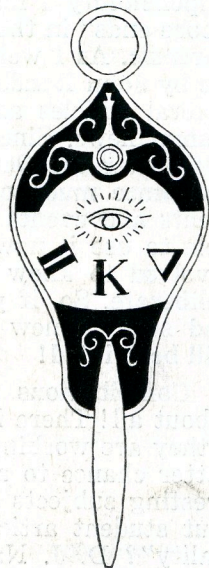
In transferring the editorial function and responsibility from one man to another, I suppose it is inevitable that some loose ends will go undiscovered and be lost. I have discovered that in the assumption of that editorial function and responsibility I inadvertently overlooked some "loose ends" in the form of some items for **The Forensic**.
